# NEW RATE BASIS IS SUGGESTED

Amendment To Ohio Law Governing Utility Costs is Proposed

CLEVELAND, Aug. 18—(AP)—An amendment to the Ohio constitution requiring the Ohio Public Utilities Commission to fix utility rates on the basis of the money a public utility has "prudently invested" for the customers' service was proposed today by the Cleveland's city law department.

In a report prepared for city council, Law Director Thomas A. Burke, Jr., and Assistant Director Spencer W. Reeder said the amendment could wipe out the reproduction cost method of rate making.

The report, requested by city council, grows out of a federal power commission order requiring the Hope Natural Gas Co. of West Virginia to reduce by approximately \$2,815,000 a year its rate to the East Ohio Gas Co. of Cleveland. The commission's decision said investment figures "now become all important in rate regulations."

The Ohio Utilities Commission, in determining the cost takes into consideration the cost that would be entailed if a utility were to reproduce its entire plant on a given date.

To put the amendment on the ballot by petition would require the signature of 10 per cent of the Ohio electorate, with at least half the 88 counties each supplying signatures of 5 per cent of its electorate.

# DAYTON MAN IS HELD ON MAIL FRAUD CHARGES

CINCINNATI, O., Aug. 18—(UP)—Wilburn N. Unthank, 27, of Dayton, pleaded innocent yesterday when arraigned before U. S. Commissioner J. Paul Goehagen on charges of fraudulently receiving registered letters sent thru the mail.

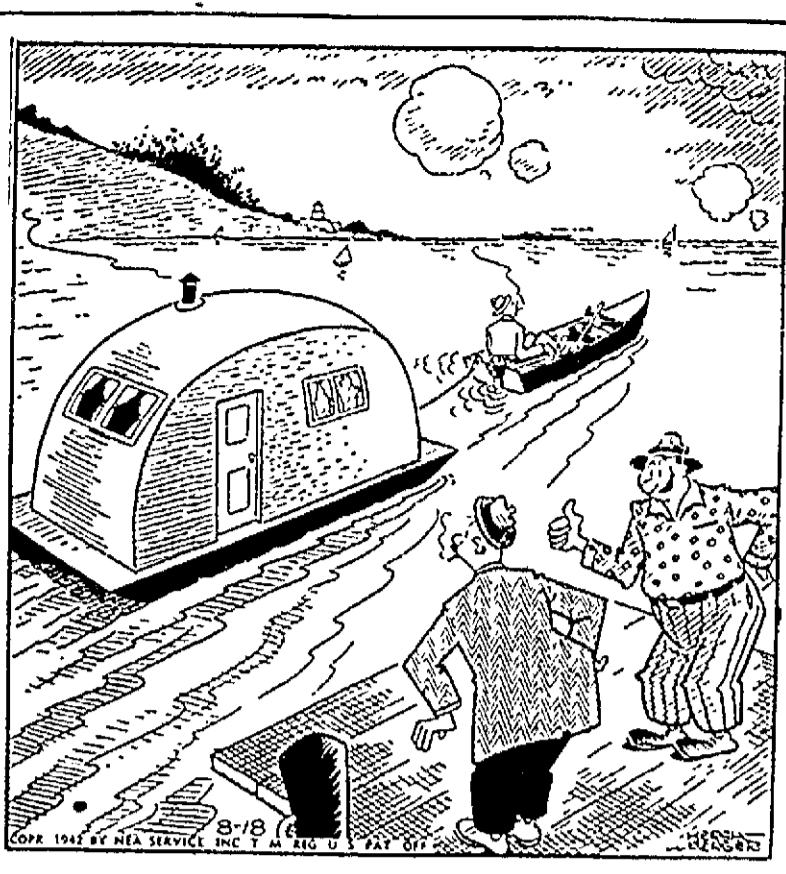
He was held under \$1,000 bond for hearing Aug. 25. Postoffice inspectors charged that Unthank obtained rare stamps from dealers in the United States and Canada by sending unsigned checks with his mail orders, then refusing to sign the checks when they were returned with the stamps ordered.

Most films have highlights on which to concentrate. "Gone With The Wind" has so many that a reviewer is mentally handcuffed. It is one supreme composite highlight—the entire picture, from the impressive presentation of the title, to the last pictorially inspiring fade-out. It is truly the greatest picture ever made and, since it follows so faithfully Margaret Mitchell's story of the Old South that one is left wondering how it was ever achieved, it must follow that Mrs. Mitchell's story must be the Great American novel.

The whole world felt that Clark Gable was the perfect Rhett Butler. He is, and gives his greatest performance. Technicolor even enhances his amazing personality. As for Vivien Leigh, she emerges as a star whose perfection as Scarlett is almost beyond belief. Not only is she an overnight star but the greatest film discovery of this or any other year. She and Gable make Scarlett and Rhett so real that cinema magic seems to turn into life itself.

It is difficult to conceive of Olivia de Havilland ever giving a greater performance, so magnificent she is as Melanie. Leslie Howard always is great, but he's never been greater than as Ashley. There are perhaps several dozen other players on which one could well go into ecstasies, but space does not permit. Several supporting players do deserve mention. Thomas Mitchell is outstanding as Gerald O'Hara, Hattie McDaniel does as much for her race with her portly quality as any of the greatest Negroes in history.
