we've come to the point where either we've got to get out of here or I'm afraid we're going to have trouble.

Joint Structure for Economy
"We won't give up our effort to get together with the county on a joint county-city building, but if we can't, the city should go ahead alone," the mayor added.

The joint city-county plan is the only logical way to save money, because it means a single plumbing, heating and lighting systems, one set of hallways and entrances, one roof, "and so on indefinitely," he pointed out.

The committee, however, should "think about a site" for the proposed city auditorium, he said.

"Let's get our city hall first, then talk about an auditorium," urged Karstens, who after climbing the same long stairways for more than 25 years, particularly lamented the lack of an elevator in the present municipal building.
