"Pardon My Sarong" Will Open On Saturday; Latest In Blondie Series Is Viewable At Quilna's Friday Preview

In the slip stream of "Gone With the Wind" now in the last gasp of its gusty grandeur comes another sizzco styled sensation, "Pardon My Sarong." This breezy opus, replete with Bud Abbott and Lou Costello is the balmy hit bit those goon gents have yet put out. It starts Saturday at the Ohio. Lushness is added by Virginia Bruce and hot harmony by the Four Ink Spots.

The patter of tiny feet comes to the Bunsted household with the arrival at Friday's evening preview at the Quilna theatre of "Blondie's Blessed Event." This Chic Young cinematic comic strip conversion is definitely "family" entertainment, but good. A thriller, "A Desperate Chance for Ellery Queen" should do big things for you "Whodunnit?" fans. In the interim thruout Friday "Joan of Ozark" and "Remember Pearl Harbor" are observable.

A positive must in any moviegoers program is the music marvel "Fantasia" now in its last showings at the Sigma theatre. Although strictly a jive juke myself, this column was enthralled every minute of the film. Going along with the superb Stokowski musicalized film is "Hilbilly Blitzkrieg" executed in Barney Google style.

A jolly gruesome thing, check full of gossamer plotting situations and pile of pseudo scientific paraphernalia is "The Ghost of Frankenstein" now displayed at the State theatre. Timely as the commando raids on German occupied France is the second attraction, "This Was Paris." It features that old slicker from the silents, Ben Lyon.

There's an abundance of action with gunfire every other minute in the Lyric theatre's offerings released Friday. First one is "Royal Mounted Patrol" starring Charles Starrett and Russell Hayden. "Suicide Squadron", the go-long piece, is a sky fighter thriller.

The nation's two foremost screwball comics have done it again, on a bigger, and even balmyer scale.

If you are one of those doubting Thomases, go to the Ohio theatre where Abbott and Costello's newest Universal hit, "Pardon My Sarong," is making people lean back and laugh until their sides ache, commencing Saturday. The comedy kings have three times the opportunity of being funny, since they start out as bus drivers in Chicago who get bored with the monotonous day-in-day-out ride on the same old route. So they leap at the chance to take a charter trip to Los Angeles, ferreting a wealthy playboy and ten cute chorus girls.

With only five left, he started locking the barn door. July 21 came, and Cow No. 4 went. The door was found wide open. Mr. Journey called in the police.

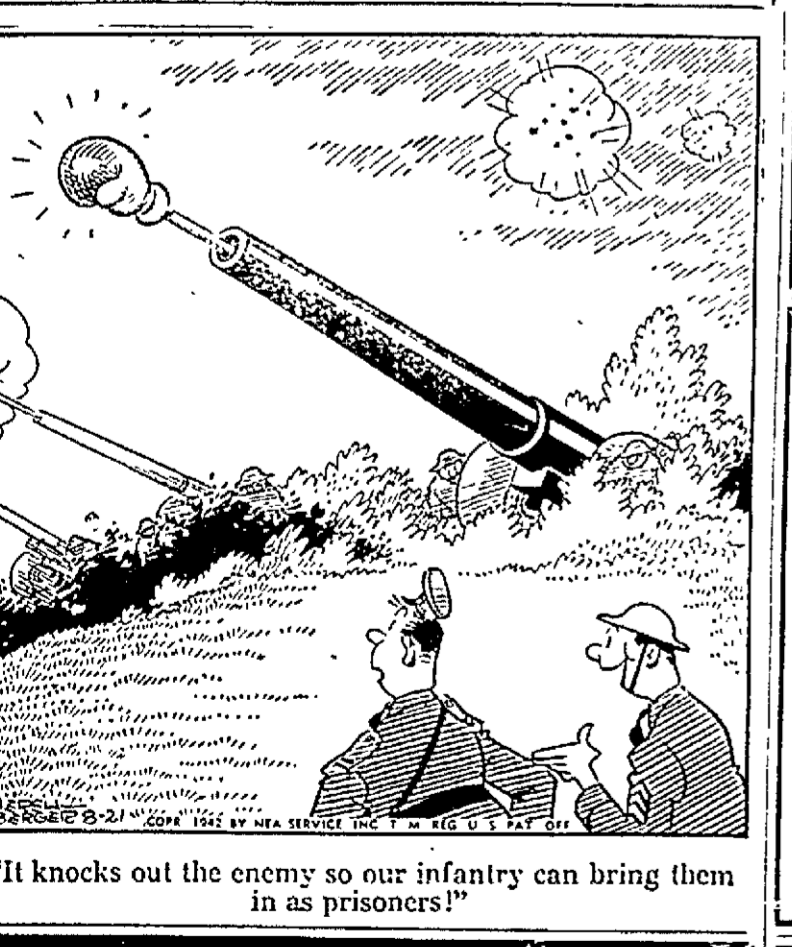
THE MOTORMAN WAS CAREFUL

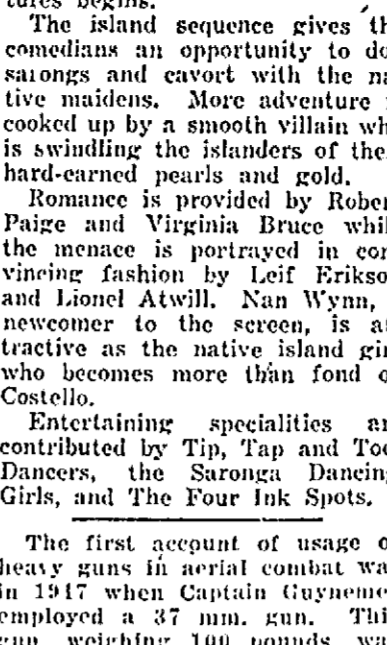
