## TEACHER POSTS REMAIN VACANT

### Further Resignations Disrupt Pre-School Plans In Putnam-co

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, Aug. 28—Officials of the Putnam-co schools still are faced with a teacher shortage with the opening of the 1942-43 term only two weeks away. County Supt. Carl D. Vermilya revealed today.

Some vacancies have been filled but others keep developing to prevent districts from completing faculties. Norman Irvin today resigned as coach and high school principal in the Ottawa public schools to accept a job in a defense plant. Another resignation was that of Miss Jean Marshall who had been hired to teach music in the Continental-Palmer high school.

Miss Ruth Robenalt who was hired previously to teach social science and English in the Continental-Palmer schools has been shifted to the music vacancy and there now exists a social science-English vacancy there.

E. D. Radenbaugh who resigned this summer as coach and industrial arts teacher at Leipsic has consented to teach industrial arts

part-time along with his working in a Lima defense plant.

Mrs. Willard Schuder has been hired to teach elementary subjects at Columbus Grove and Mrs. Jeanette Myers of Kalida has been hired as mathematics and science teacher at Vaughnsville. At Gilboa, Mrs. Melvin Hartman has been named first grade teacher and W. S. Wallen of Findlay has been hired to teach industrial arts and Latin.

## OHIO RETAIL SALES DECLINE DURING JULY

### Six Per Cent Slump In Dollar Volume From 1941 Level Disclosed

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 28—(UP)—Ohio independent retailers reported a six per cent decline in dollar sales volume during July, compared with the same month a year ago, Ohio State University's business research reported today.

The loss in July reduced the net dollar volume gain to three per cent in the first seven months of this year against the same period of 1941.

Non-durable goods lines continued to show substantial sales gains ranging up to 22 per cent in foot-wear sales, but the durable goods lines showed heavy losses. Motor vehicle dealers took a 73 per cent loss in dollar sales volume in July, compared with the same month last year.

Sales of drug stores, cafeterias and lunch rooms were up 21 per cent last month. Groceries and food stores reported 19 per cent gains.

Dayton was the only one of Ohio's eight large cities to show a gain for the month in dollar

sales. Its increase was 8 per cent over July, 1941.

Akron showed a 5 per cent loss from last year, 9 per cent loss from June, 1942, and 1 per cent gain for the first seven months of this year.

Cincinnati showed an 11 per cent loss from last year, Cleveland 4 per cent; Columbus 4 per cent; Toledo 3 per cent, and Youngstown 18 per cent.

Dayton showed a 2 per cent loss from June, but a 7 per cent gain for the first seven months of this year.

## SIDNEY MAN IS HELD TO GRAND JURY AT PIQUA

(Special To The Lima News) SIDNEY, Aug. 28—James Eshman of this city has filed an action in common pleas court against William Long of Sidney, asking damages in the sum of \$5,615.

The action grew out of trouble in Piqua on Aug. 9, when Long is alleged to have blocked the street with his car as Eshman drove up. As Eshman got out of his car and approached the other auto to ascertain the cause, Long allegedly assaulted and cut the face of Eshman, causing a deep and severe wound on the left side of his face.

Following the trouble, Long was arrested, taken before the municipal court at Piqua and was bound over to the Miami-co grand jury under bond of \$1,000.

FUND ALLOCATED WASHINGTON, Aug. 28—(AP)—The agriculture department has allocated \$72,000 to Ohio to enable tenants to obtain farm purchase loans under provisions of the 1937 Bank-Jones farm tenant act. The sum is part of \$22,500,000 allocated nationwide under congressional authorization for the 1942-43 tenant program.
