Network To Devote Time To Sale Of War Bonds, Stamps

Outstanding Stars Of Radio And Screen To Take Prominent Part In Program Saturday

For the first time in radio history an entire network will go on the air Saturday night to sell War Bonds directly to listeners.

From 9 p. m. Saturday to 4 a. m. Sunday, radio, stage, and screen stars and the nation's leading dance bands will be featured by WJZ. Through the night the network and individual stations will appeal to listeners to send in orders for War Bonds by Western Union, telephone, or mail. Staffs will be on hand to handle all orders. In some instances purchasers of War Bonds will go on the air. More than 120 local stations have prepared local features which will be cut into the blue network program at intervals during the night.

The network show will be opened with a two-hour production called "I Pledge America." Orson Welles will be the producer and master of ceremonies from Hollywood. Talent will include Amos and Andy, Edward G. Robinson, Red Skelton, Nelson Eddy, Fanny Brice, Dinah Shore, Jane Froman, Bob Burns, and Lanny Ross. Frank Black and his symphony orchestra will broadcast from New York City where William Baehar will be in charge. Pick-ups from four soldiers in Australia, England, Iceland, and Panama for special War Bond appeals are planned.

From 11 to 11:15 p. m. Eastern War Time local stations will put on their own programs with local personalities acting as minute men. From 11:15 to 4 a. m. Eastern War Time the network will continue with a band jammer, Gray, Xavier Cugat, Horace Heidt, Paul Whiteman, Jimmy Dorsey, Skully Ennis, Duke Ellington, Tommy Dorsey, Glenn Miller, Johnny Long, Bobby Byrnes, Alvin Roy, Vaughn Monroe, Tommy Tucker, Charley Spivak, Count Basie, Woody Herman, Frankie Masters and Ted Fio Rito.

The network will carry a running story of War Bonds sales totals flashed to New York City for compilation.

Dedication ceremonies in connection with the re-opening of the enlarged and modernized Service Club No. 2, will highlight the Camp Shobly Victory Salute program which will be aired over station WJZ Saturday, 10:30 p. m.

The broadcast will come from the beautiful new ballroom of Service Club No. 2—now the largest club of its kind in any Army camp in the United States.

Among the guests of honor who will be introduced by the senior hostess, Miss Wilhelmina Robinson, will be Brig Gen. Russell G. Burdick of the 74th Field Artillery Brigade, who was born in Wapakoneta and spent his childhood in Columbus Grove. For the past 25 years he has made
