

### Paratroopers **Just Miss Cactus Plants**

WITH THE U. S. ARMY IN THE CALIFORNIA DESERT jump anywhere in war." The veteran parachutists, un-

der the command of Maj. G. J. McGowan, tumbled out of a huge transport plane only 800 feet above the desert and landed with precision and accuracy within a 500-foot circle. "It was the fastest descent ever

made by our chutists," Mc-Gowan said after the leap which was made under conditions closely paralleling those in North Nowhere in the California des-

ed winds made jumps unusually rapid and chutists must be ready for spine-shaking landings across prickly cactus rocks. "But you have to jump any-

where in war," said McGowan, "and the only way you can train for it is to do it." "For the first time," Cline said, "I didn't have time to turn around and make a forward roll. I had to tumble backwards. With a full pack I would have been in

a very rough position." The chutists watched for cactus patches on the way down and avoided injuries. The jumpers were all veterans of the air borne command, one of the army's toughest and hardest hitting forces. Army paratroopers have more than 70,000 jumps to their credit and only two fatalities.

The safety record resulted from each man packing his own chute, it was said. German parachutes were packed by women noncombatants, and one chute in every 10 was said to have failed to open over Crete.
