

Leslie Howard's New Film Opens At State Thursday

Anti-Axis Presentation Offered On Double Bill With "I Married An Angel;" "Eagle Squadron" At Ohio

Excellent boring from within tactics are presented in the film "Mr. V" slated to open Thursday at the State theatre. Leslie Howard, he of the great restraint and controlled power in acting, plays the lead role in this anti Axis presentation. The second proffering at the State is "I Married An Angel."

Until the arrival of this the above mentioned doubly attractive dual role program, the W. Market-st movie palace presents "Lady in a Jam," with Irene Dunne, plus Humphrey Bogart in a thrill shot special, "The Big Shot."

The Battle of Britain, one of the historic phases of this World war forms an exciting sequence in the production "Eagle Squadron" now showing at the Ohio theatre. Streets of London during a Nazi air raid are shown. Robert Stack and Diana Barrymore are the headliners in the cast.

Hall, whose "This Thing Called Love," "Hero Comes Mr. Jordan" and "Bedtime Story" were romantic comedy milestones during the past year, also directed "They All Kissed the Bride" at Columbia with Joan Crawford and Melvyn Douglas in the top spots. The love-and-laughfest is now at the Quinal theatre.




