### Three Harvard Professors And One Student To Participate; One Heads Board Of Joint Economic Warfare

"What Price Victory?" a consideration of the sacrifices all Americans will have to make to crush the enemy, will be discussed on "America's Town Meeting of the Air," broadcast from the Saunders theatre on the Harvard university campus, Thursday at 9 p. m. via WJZ.

The speakers will be Dr. Alvin H. Hansen, professor of political economy at Harvard, now on leave to take the post of chairman of the Board of Joint Economic Warfare, and special economic adviser to the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System; Dr. William E. Hoeking, chairman of the Department of Philosophy at Harvard; Dr. Crane Brinton, of the Department of History at Harvard; Thomas D. Matthews, a senior student majoring in government and president of the Student Council.

# WOMEN ELIGIBLE FOR ELECTION TO AAA POSTS

**COLUMBUS, O.**, Sept. 10—(AP)—Election of women to office on Agricultural Adjustment Administration committees in AAA county and community balloting Sept. 18 was urged today by Elmer F. Kruse, Ohio AAA chairman.

Kruse pointed out that recent changes in the AAA articles of association made farm wives eligible to vote in AAA elections and to hold committee posts. Formerly only women regarded as sole or joint operators of farms were eligible.

Citing increased use of women in war industry, Kruse observed he could "see no reason why farm women should not prove as capable as their urban sisters."
