



# Scrap Falls **Below Quota**

July 15 Per Cent Under Schedule

WASHINGTON - (U.R) - The War Production board reported today that iron and steel scrap shipments to mills in July fell short by 433,000 tons; or 15 per cent, of the monthly schedule required to meet the 17,000,000 ton quota for the last six months of Actual shipments to consuming

mills for the month amounted to 2,400,000 of the scheduled 2,833,000 tons.
"This is particularly serious in

view of the fact that July should be one of the best months for the movement of scrap material," Paul C. Cabot, deputy director of the WPB conservation division, observed. The figures, Cabot said, did not

cover all the scrap material col-lected during July which had not been prepared for shipment, and did not reflect the increase resulting from the iron and steel scrap collection campaign which got un-der way on July 20. WPB officials said that although there was now a 45-day overall

supply of iron and steel scrap, about 15 mills have less than two weeks' stocks. They said it would be impossible to build up reserves to maintain furnaces at capacity throughout the winter unless the scrap collection campaign met the quota of 17,000,000 tons by Jan. 1. State shipments in July in relation to their six-months overall quota included:

### Navy Will Name **Escort Vessel** for State Hero

WASHINGTON - (U.P.) - The navy announced Thursday that it is honoring 25 war heroes—all but one of whom gave their lives in the present conflict—by naming escort vessels for them.

These ships, now under con-struction, are similar, though smaller, than destroyers and were especially designed for use in con-voy work. Eighteen of these to be honored were victims of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. One was named a World war hero. The list of vessels and the names of the honored heroes include:


