

found that the conquest of new countries yielded them loot in rolling stock, but that it also brought goods throughout Europe, A train going through Germany today, whether it is carrying food from France, taking trucks to the Russian front, or hauling coal to Italy, looks like a railway League of Nations. The cars are from every point in Europe and are identified in languages ranging from Polish

and Czech to Dutch and French. The Nazis seized 250,000 cars and 3,000 locomotives in France alone, but in Russia they got only relatively few of the 7,000 locomotives there, and they had to change the gauge on those. The looting possibilities in Europe have about been exhausted.
