

Fred Astaire On Screen At Ohio During Personal Visit

Dancer And Bing Crosby Share Honors In "Hollywood Inn;" He'll Step It Off At Country Club Sunday

Fred Astaire's fast-stepping toes can be seen both on the Ohio theatre screen starting Saturday, and in person at a movie stars luncheon Sunday at Shawnee Country club, where he and Hugh Herbert and Ilona Massey will entertain purchasers of war bonds as a part of Lima's "pledge to the nation" celebration.

Astaire and Bing Crosby, noted for his gifted tonsils, are the stars of "Hollywood Inn," commencing at the Ohio Saturday. Marjorie Reynolds, one of Hollywood's newest lovelies, has the feminine lead in the film which also contains the music of Irving Berlin. Showing for the last time Friday is "Yankee Doodle Dandy," starring James Cagney.

The women behind the men behind the musical instruments provide the theme for the current Quilna film, "Orchestra Wives," which offers Glenn Miller and his band, George Montgomery and Ann Rutherford in the starring roles. Others who appear in prominent roles include Lynn Bari, Carole Landis, Cesar Romero, Virginia Gilmore and Mary Beth Hughes.

Barbara Stanwyck, Joel McCrea and Brian Donlevy are the stars of the current State film, "The Great Man's Lady," a story covering a span of many years. The co-feature, "Butch Minds the Baby," tells of a tough kangster playing nurse-maid to an infant, with Brod Crawford and Virginia Bruce in the leading roles.

"The Man Who Returned to Life," a strange and powerful drama of a man who came back from the grave, after having been declared legally dead, will have its first local showing at the Lyric theatre on Friday. The film features John Howard in the leading role. Also on the screen is "Stagecoach Buckaroo," starring Johnny Mack Brown.

The gun-smoked exploits of the most spectacular fighting peace marshal the West ever knew, Wyatt Earp, will be brought thrillingly to the Sigma screen Saturday when "Tombsone—the Town Too Tough to Die," commences a four-day run. Richard Dix, Kent Taylor and Edgar Buchanan head the cast. Marjorie Main, Zasu Pitts and Aline McMahon are the stars of the second feature, "Tish."

Altho the title is vaguely reminiscent of some of Boris Karloff's more frightening horror films, "The Man Who Returned to Life," now at the Lyric theatre, is not a scientific Karloff thriller by any means. Instead, it is a cleverly planned, brilliantly enacted drama concerning a man faced with the problem of surrendering to the law in order to save an innocent man, who has been convicted of murder.

John Howard, who is proving his versatility more with each new picture he makes, is excellent in the leading role, while Lucile Fairbanks, Marcella Martin, Ruth Ford and Paul Guilfoyle are all perfect in their supporting parts. The story, which was adapted to the screen by Gordon Ripley, employs the flashback technique and opens with Howard approaching middle age; then goes back thru the years, showing him as a young man in a small southern city.

Involved in a scandal, Howard is arrested and tried on a charge of murder. While he is out on bail, the murdered girl's brother, played by Guilfoyle, organizes a lynching party and goes searching for the supposed killer. As soon as Howard gets wind of the party being planned for him, he runs away; realizing of course, that this action will make his guilt seem certain.

Drifting west, he settles in a California town, changes his name, marries and is living the

OHIO'S BUMPER TOMATO CROP IS BEING PACKED

COLUMBUS, Sept. 18—(UP)—Ohio's bumper tomato crop is being canned for our soldiers overseas with "only a negligible amount" going to waste, the U. S. Employment Service reported today.

Wade Hammond, director of the USES in Ohio, said, in answer to complaints that tomatoes were rotting on the vines for lack of pickers and canners, that tomatoes were going to waste only "in places where the management has caused its own troubles."

"The Lutz cannery at Defiance had trouble because it cut the rate for peelers from 3 1/2 cents a No. 10 can to 3 cents," he said. "That brought a work stoppage and an NLRB election which resulted in unionization of the plant." He said that there was "some trouble" at Weston because a plant operator refused to hire women over 50 years of age to peel tomatoes "and then ordered that workers could not sit down to work."

WPB TO SURVEY OHIO FOR MORE TYPEWRITERS

COLUMBUS, Sept. 18 — (UP)—The War Production Board, in a move to obtain privately-owned late model typewriters for use by the armed forces, today began a survey of all schools, industry and business in the state.

Since the manufacture of typewriters by all except one of the smaller producers has been halted by the WPB, the demands for typewriters will exceed the supply. B. C. Zuhars, WPB district manager said.

Schools will be asked to rearrange their schedules to release some of their typewriters and business houses will be asked to report the number of typewriters available for the government, he added.
