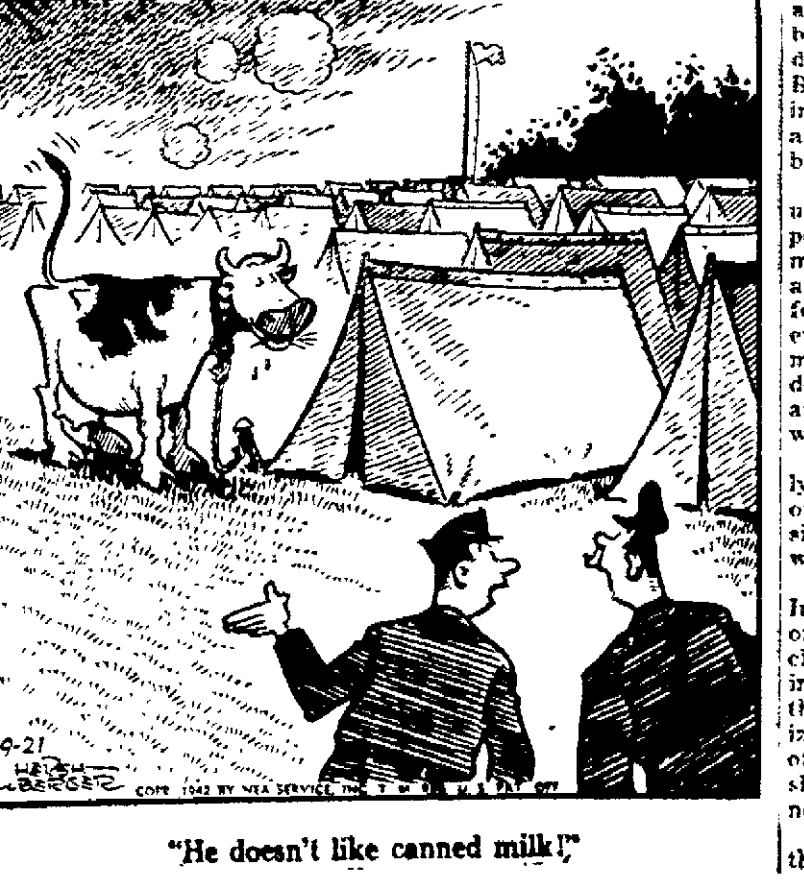

JAP MILITARY BASES BOMBED

Five Barges, Tugboat Burned In Allied Fighters Raid On Lae

GENERAL MACARTHUR'S HEADQUARTERS, Australia, Sept. 21.—(AP)—Operating without interference from enemy planes, allied fighters attacked the vital Japanese base at Lae on the northeast coast of New Guinea for the third successive day yesterday, burning five barges and a tugboat and damaging shore installations.

On the New Guinea ground front allied headquarters reported "no change in the general situation," indicating the Japanese still were stalled at Ioribaiwa, a hamlet on the southern slopes of the Owen Stanley mountains, 32 miles air-line from Port Moresby.

WARNING GIVEN ON REFUSAL TO SELL COFFEE

LEGION BACKS U. S. WAR EFFORT

Sacrifices Must Be Made To Bring Victory, Veterans Say At Convention

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 21.—(INS)—The American Legion, assembled at its 24th annual convention, was on record today as giving its full support to President Roosevelt in the prosecution of World War 2 into Legion membership.

By opening its membership to the men of this war, the Legion, now composed of 1,130,000 veterans of the conflict of 1917-18, conservably could become one of the most influential veterans' organizations in all history.

The Legion expressed "complete confidence and faith" in President Roosevelt's leadership. To win the war, the Legion said in a "declaration of principles," industry, labor, agriculture and government must make considerable contributions and sacrifices.

WILLKIE HOPES TO VISIT FRONT

Special Message From U. S. To Stalin Will Be Delivered In Few Days

MOSCOW, Sept. 21.—(INS)—Wendell L. Willkie, within a few hours after he arrived in Moscow on a globe-girdling special mission for President Roosevelt, revealed today that he has requested Soviet officials to allow him to visit the Russian battle-front.

Willkie, who said he was highly impressed by the morale of the Russian people, revealed he hoped to leave for the front in a few days.

He is carrying a special message for Josef Stalin from President Roosevelt and said he wanted to see the Russian leader as soon as possible. On his arrival at the airport from Kuibyshev, Willkie was greeted by high Russian officials.

"I personally favor a second front if the military people think it feasible. The morale value of it would be enormous. The second front has become almost a symbol for the Russian people of the kind of aid they feel entitled to receive from Great Britain and America."

TAX COLLECTION SHOWS UPTURN OVER LAST YEAR

Tax collections for the last half of 1941, which closed Sept. 12, exceeded those of a similar period for 1940 by \$17,670,333, it was revealed Saturday by Ray W. Barnett, Allen Co. treasurer.

In the collection just closed a total of \$829,398.99 was taken in, while last year only \$811,828.66 was received in the treasurer's office.
