Barbara Jean Triplett was elected chairman of the student assembly committee to plan programs for the school assemblies during the year.

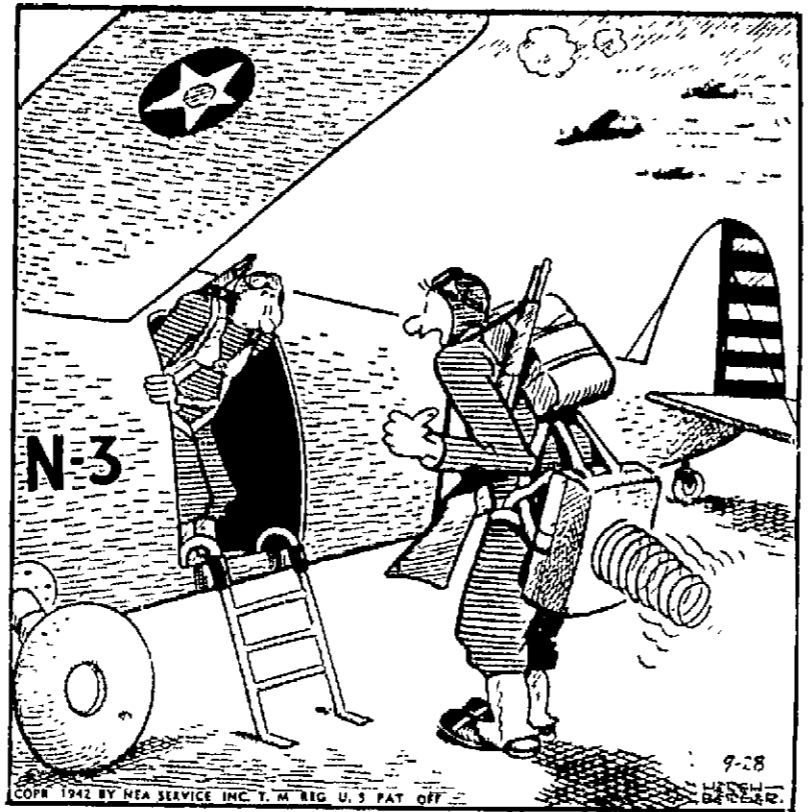

RAIL INDUSTRY FACING INQUIRY

Federal Grand Jury Meets In Chicago Thursday For Investigation

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—(AP)—The nation's entire transportation industry will be scrutinized by federal grand juries in nine cities, it was reported reliably today, in what promises to be the justice department's largest anti-trust investigation thus far.

Justice officials are understood to have advised the war, navy and agriculture departments and the interstate commerce commission, office of defense transportation, civil aeronautics board and office of price administration of the plans and to have received no objection.
