Cary Grant, Jean Arthur And Ronald Colman Star In Exciting New Romantic Comedy Slated For Preview

Cary Grant, Jean Arthur and Ronald Colman are starred in the exciting new romantic comedy, "The Talk of the Town," which commences at the Wednesday preview of the Quilna theatre.

A thrilling chapter in frontier history is depicted in the Wednesday Sigma film, "Apache Trail," starring Lloyd Nolan, Donna Reed, William Lundigan and Ann Ayars.

OTTAWA, Sept. 29.—Credit for 18 men who have enlisted in various branches of military service during the last few weeks has been received by the Putnam-co Selective Service board on its September draft call, it was reported here today.

A contingent of draftees went to Toledo Saturday for final physical examinations but the draft board has not received the official list of those who were accepted and inducted.

TRAVEL DEATH DECREE APPEALED TO U. S. COURT

JUDGE ISSUES RAILROAD BOND PAYMENT ORDER

\$110,190 Will Be Distributed To A. C. And Y. Security Holders

CLEVELAND, Sept. 29.—(AP)—Payments totaling \$110,190 to bondholders of the Akron, Canton & Youngstown railroad and its subsidiary, the Northern Ohio railroad, have been authorized by Federal Judge Paul Jones.

In a suit brought by George O. Sharp of New York, representing a bondholders' committee, Judge Jones issued an order paying the way for payments only to holders of A. C. & Y. bonds at this time. He specified that amounts to be distributed to Northern Ohio bondholders be set aside in a special fund to be released by a latter order.

The payments represent partial dividends for the year ending tomorrow on preferred stock issuable to bondholders under an Oct. 1, 1938, reorganization plan.

Under this plan, holders of old bonds were to receive 60 per cent of their total in new bonds, 30 per cent in preferred shares and 20 per cent in common shares. Twice appealed to the United States circuit court of appeals which has upheld Judge Jones' approval, the plan now is pending before the United States supreme court.

Because of the litigation, holders have not been able to collect interest on bonds except in the form of dividends authorized by the court. The first such payment was authorized in 1940.

MCGUFFEY MAN FINED

WILMINGTON, Sept. 29.—Carl Wildenmuth of McGuffey, Monday was fined \$100 and costs before Justice of the Peace Lyman P. Clark of Alger on charges of disturbing the peace and malicious destruction of property. The court was told, Clark said, that Wildenmuth attempted to destroy his home by setting his mattress afire last week. The mattress was destroyed.
