State CAP Plans **Courier Service** for War Plants

60 Firms to Use Civil Air Facilities to Speed Production

Wisconsin's major war indusries soon will be given courier ervice by air, according to Maj. ohn F. Stratton, commander of the Wisconsin wing of the civil air patrol, who announced today that more than 60 firms have agreed to accept the facilities of CAP in order to speed production.

Intended to hasten the dispatch of personnel, important papers and vital equipment, the CAP program is based on suggestions issued by the national headquarters in Washington and is now being carried out in several states, Maj. Stratton said.

"We do not propose to compete with any existing transportation agencies," he pointed out. 




