

President to Help Launch Human Needs Drive Monday

Formal launching of the 1942 Community Mobilization for Human Needs campaign, featuring a brief address by Pres. Roosevelt, will be heard in a joint broadcast over WIBA, WMAQ, WENR, WGN, WBBM, and other stations, from 9:30 to 10 p. m. Monday.

The president, who has opened the drive each year since taking office, will be heard from an undisclosed point of origin. He will be introduced to the nation by Tom K. Smith, president of the Boatmen's National bank of St. Louis, chairman of the Community Mobilization.

Entertainment, featuring a special dramatic skit by the cast of "Blondie" and music by the Philadelphia orchestra under Eugene Ormandy, also will mark the broadcast.

Stoughton Farm Will Be Scene of Broadcast

Army Hour Show Carried at 2:30; Benny Returns

A farm near Stoughton will be the scene of one of the pickups used by the Army Hour at 2:30 p. m. today on WIBA, in a program demonstrating the vital role of food in the war effort.

One other warm, located near Greeley, Colo., will be used in the broadcast. Three pickups from army camps will bring broadcasts of soldiers at breakfast, lunch, and dinner, the latter from overseas. Other pickups will be made in Chicago, at spots where army food is purchased, processed, stored, and tested. A cooking demonstration will come from Ft. Totten, N. Y.

Another WIBA highlight today will be the return of Jack Benny's show at 6 tonight, with Mary Livingston, Don Wilson, Dennis Day, Phil Harris, and Rochester on deck. 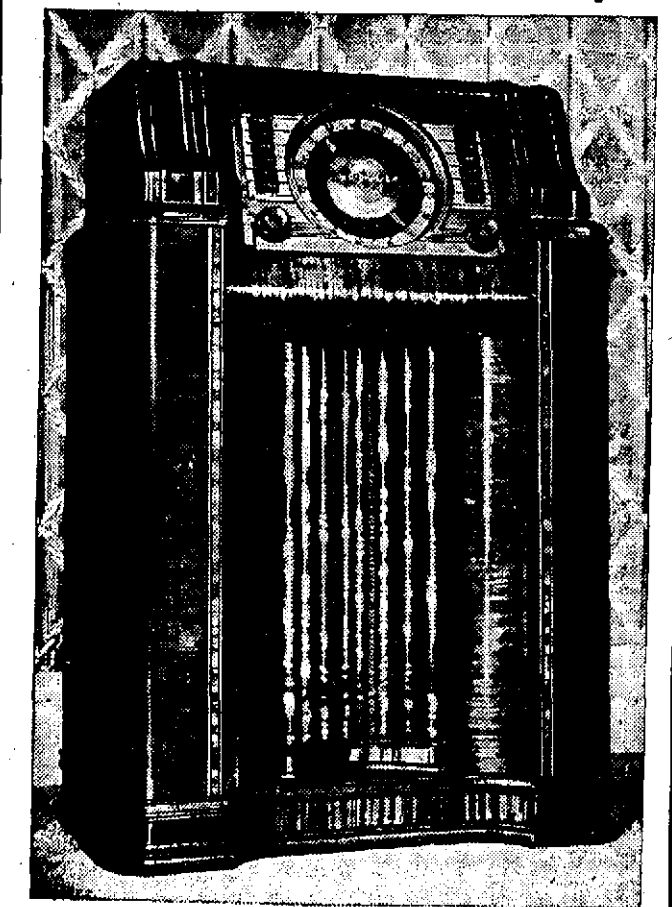
