Service Teams Take Spotlight on Air Saturday

Pres. Roosevelt will deliver a service chat to the nation Monday at 9 p.m. over the major networks.

The White house has not announced the topic of the address but informed circles believe the president may discuss his recent tour of the nation's war production centers and report on the progress of the war on both the fighting and the home fronts.

Columbus day features a football game involving two service teams will headline this week's radio offerings.

An important address by Alty. Gen. Francis Biddle and dramatic programs featuring Orson Welles and Morris Carnovsky will top the Monday offerings, while Saturday will bring the Wisconsin Great Lakes and Notre Dame-Sc. Hawks grid games.
