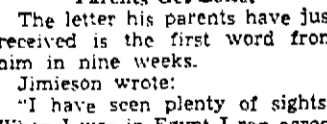

Run Obstacle Course "We also run the men through an obstacle course that is so hard and rugged that it will toughen up the weakest. No kidding. It's really a honey."

"You can see the wall that the men must climb over in the picture. The wall is 8 feet high. They go over it in all kinds of ways."

"The obstacle course consists of hurdles, ditches, walls, trees that have fallen down, a ditch with a fence laid over it so that the men have to crawl on their hands and knees for a distance, and trees that are close together so that the men have to dodge through."
