

Einstein And Jack Benny Are Cast By March Of Time

Physicist And Comedian Will Join In Promotion Of America's War Effort On Thursday Night Program

A most unusual array of guest stars will appear on the March of Time program Thursday when Albert Einstein, world's No. 1 physicist, and Jack Benny, famed Hollywood comedian, come on the show from opposite sides of the continent to promote America's war program. The broadcast goes on the air at 10:30 p. m. over WEA-F.

Speaking from his Princeton, N. J., home on the anniversary of the Balfour Declaration, Prof. Einstein will discuss the war role of the Jewish people and their program for post-war reconstruction. The famed exile from Nazi persecution will be making his first radio address since becoming a United States citizen.

Henry Aldrich starts on a camping trip but gets no further than bed when Mrs. Aldrich puts her foot down on his October outing in "The Aldrich Family" broadcast over WEA-F on Thursday at 8:30 p. m.

"Pied Piper" To Be Shown At Quilna Preview Friday

Tender And Moving Story Scheduled To Succeed Sonja Henie's Latest Ice-Skating Picture

One of the most tender and moving stories ever presented on the screen is due to make its first appearance in Lima Friday evening when it will be previewed at the Quilna theatre. The picture, "The Pied Piper," stars Monty Woolley as the gruff Englishman who befriends a group of children.

A thrill-packed film starring Errol Flynn and Ronald Reagan, "Desperate Journey," now at the Ohio theatre, taxes the nerves to the utmost as they fight their way thru more adventures than a person could imagine.

The picture starts just a few days before the Pacific atoll was attacked. Even then there was a sense of impending danger which led to the island being fortified.

Then it came, The invading forces hunted their night by land, sea and air against a handful of Marines and civilians. Against these heroic defenders the Japs had to pay a terrific toll and for something they're going to have to give back anyway.

Each performance of the actors is flawless. They themselves go thru their roles as the inspired, which they undoubtedly were, just as the entire American public was by the magnificent stand made by our Marines.

It is "Wake Island," a masterpiece of a movie telling the story of the little band of outnumbered Marines who for 14 days stood off the pounding of Jap invasion forces and by so doing thrilled the hearts of all Americans and wrote glorious Marine history.

Paramount gathered together a brilliant cast to portray the many real-life roles. Heading the list are Brian Donlevy, Robert Preston, Macdonald Carey, Albert Dekker, Walter Abel, Barbara Britton and William Bendix.

The fact that "Wake Island" was filmed with complete Marine Corps co-operation stands out unmistakably. The realistic land, sea and air battles are thrilling testimonials to that fact.

"Wake Island," bear in mind,

The novel, which first appeared serially in Collier's magazine and later in condensed form in Reader's Digest, has won the highest kind of praise from the book reviewers. The film tells in graphic detail the difficulties encountered in their perilous journey. Starting in the South of France as the gigantic German attack was launched in the tragic month of June, 1940, the Englishman manages to make his halting way home, shepherding his straggling group of youngsters right under the very nose of the dreaded Gestapo.

Monty Woolley, who scored so heavily in "The Man Who Came to Dinner," essays a new dramatic role in "The Pied Piper." Cast as a stately Englishman, the bewickered former Yale drama professor has his best as he outwits the Gestapo while the children often outwit him!

Roddy McDowall, the memorable flax of "How Green Was My Valley," and lovely Anne Baxter also received praise for grand performances from preview critics.

The supporting honors are carried off by Otto Preminger and J. Carol Nash, while the production was in the capable hands of Nunnally Johnson, who also wrote the touching screenplay.

Combining the breath-taking pathos, the rich humor and the warm romance of the book, "The Pied Piper" looms as one of the outstanding pictures of the year.

Lloyd Nolan leads a double life in "Just Off Broadway," tracking down a double murderer by day and dabbling in romance by night. The film, a suspenseful mystery drama, starring popular Michael Shayne detective melodramas and also at the Quilna theatre Friday evening.

"Remember Pearl Harbor," a timely new picture, opens Friday at the Lyric theatre, and proved to be a thrilling and absorbing screen attraction, winning enthusiastic applause from a large first-night audience.

A stirring tribute to those heroes who defend our far-flung frontiers, the film—the story of which is, of course, entirely fictional—deals with the exploits of

a group of soldiers who fight bravely and heroically in defense of the Philippines against the Japanese aggressors.

Personable Donald M. Barry has one of his best roles to date as fun-loving Private "Lucky" Smith, who refuses to take Army life seriously until the time of the attack, then distinguishes himself by his valiant conduct in battle.

He is ably seconded by Alan Curtis and Maxvaid Holmes, who are seen as the pals who stick by him thru thick and thin.

Fay McKenzie, whom critics have acclaimed as one of the love-hottest and most talented of Hollywood's younger players, was new laurels with her excellent performance in this picture. The "Wilderness" is well taken care of by Sig Ruman and Rhys Williams who are cast as the ringleaders of a spy ring operating in the Philippines.

Robert Emmett Keane, Ian Keith, and Diana Del Rio also have important featured roles.

The battle sequence which provides the picture with its gripping climax is of tremendous scope, involving action on both land and sea. Brilliantly executed, these scenes are among the most spectacular ever staged in Hollywood for any motion picture.
