Wiley Offers Two Chances at West Point

WASHINGTON - Reduction of the four-year West Point military academy course to three years has given Sen. Alexander Wiley (R-Chippewa Falls) two appointments as cadets to the academy, who will be selected for appointment as a result of a preliminary examination conducted by the United States civil service commission.

Wiley said that his two appointments must qualify to enter the academy July 1, 1943, and must be not under 17 years nor over 22 years of age upon date of admission and must not be less than five feet six inches in height. Examinations will be held in Madison and other cities yet to be announced by the commission which will send examiners to Wisconsin to conduct the tests.

Wiley announced that Wisconsin young men who desired to enter the contest for possible appointment must have their letters of application on file in his office by Nov. 13, for transmission to the commission on Nov. 14, for the examinations which will be held at places yet to be designated in the place on Dec. 12.

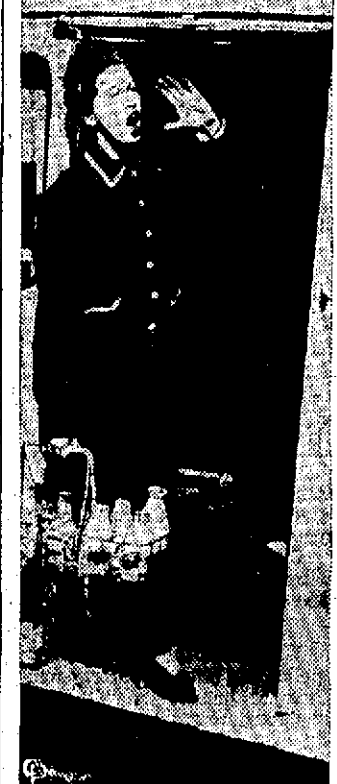
