

Nazi Fixes Mr. D. A.'s Clock In Wednesday Radio Program

Airwaves Also Will Present Merle Oberon As Eddie Cantor's Guest After Returning From Overseas

Harrington's alarm clock refuses to go off on schedule and, as a result, "Mr. District Attorney" finds himself on the trail of an escaped enemy prisoner of war, in "The Case of the Broken Alarm Clock," which airs Wednesday at 9:30 p. m. over NBC. Harrington, played by Len Doyle, brings the clock to a German clock maker, whose work is interrupted by an escaped Nazi aviator. How the clock maker reacts to the aviator's "Heil Hitler" piques the interest of "Mr. District Attorney." Jay Jostyn plays the title role, with Vicki Vola as Miss Miller. Ed Byron and Jerry Devine write the series, Byron directs. Peter Van Steeden provides the mood music.

Merle Oberon, the picture star who recently returned from England where she went to entertain

troops, will entertain more soldiers when she appears as Eddie Cantor's guest on "Time to Smile" at Camp Haan, Riverside, Calif., over NBC Wednesday at 9 p. m. Acting in concert with Cantor in making their guest feel at home will be Dinah Shore, Harry von Zell, Hattie McDaniel and the Mad Russian.

Rear Admiral William H. P. Blandy, Chief of the Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy, will be heard over WJZ Wednesday from 10:45 to 11:00 p. m., as he addresses the 31st National Safety Congress in Chicago.

Admiral Blandy will speak on the topic, "Accidents—Axis Ally," in which he will urge the adoption of increased safety measures in the nation's war plants to eliminate the terrible drain on manpower caused by accidents.

Launching a drive in which half a million Americans of German descent will pledge themselves to purchase a minimum of \$1,000 in U. S. War Bonds daily for the ensuing one hundred days, WJZ Wednesday will present a special program from 9 to 9:30 p. m.

From Washington, Speaker of the House Sam Rayburn will be heard together with George C. Voinaris, supreme president of AHEPA, formally inaugurating the bond campaign. The capital will also furnish a unique angle to the campaign thru Steve Vasilakos, who operates a peanut stand just outside the White House grounds. Steve has been designated an issuing agent for bonds and has promised that every purchaser of one will be given, gratis, a large sack of his specialty.

From Hollywood, Gary Cooper and Katina Paxinou, currently at work in the film version of "For Whom the Bell Tolls," will be heard in a dramatic sketch commemorating the second invasion of Greece by Italy and recalling the epic Greek defense. Nicola Moscona, Metropolitan Opera baritone, will be heard from New York with a choral group in several mountain songs of ancient Grecian lineage.

Walt Disney's "Fantasia" Comes To State Thursday

Theatre Co-Features "Her Cardboard Lover" With Norma Shearer, Robert Taylor, George Sanders

They thought they knew all the answers did those slip-streamlined debutantes as they headed about the gaming tables in "Gambling Daughters" currently proffered at the Lyric theatre. Besides the dice-wielding set skimmishes the Lyric audience also will meet the girls from the bureau in "Escort Girl," the number two attraction.

The suavest of smooth guys, Lloyd Nolan comes now to the Quilna screen in a tidy opus titled "Just Off Broadway." Likewise

shown at the Quilna is a well-tuned war film "The Pied Piper."

All the thrills and none of the dangers of playing a stock of chips on a winning number on roulette wheel are in store for movie-goers who visit the Lyric theatre. The film is "Gambling Daughters" and it certainly hits the entertainment jackpot when it comes to action, comedy and thrills.

The story of innocent young society school girls, lured to a crooked gambling den where they are ruthlessly victimized at the various games, the film stars Roger Price and Cecilia Parker.

While trailing the school French teacher, Professor Redoin, hoping to catch him in a romantic interlude, Lillian Harding and Katharine Thompson, students at the Lakeside School for Girls, follow him to the Angel's Roost, a gambling joint, to learn that he is a regular player. Once they are there, Chance, henchman of a mysterious and unseen club owner, intices them to play on credit. Lillian, the younger of the pair, falls in love with Chance, and over a period of days, writes him several passionate love letters. Later when the girls have lost many thousands at the crooked roulette wheels, Chance uses the letter as a club, to force them to steal val-

uable family jewels to make good their losses.

The thefts bring insurance investigator Jimmy Parker to the school, and posing as a gymnastic instructor, he is able to investigate without suspicion. After a hectic session in which he is roughly handled by the young ladies' athletic class, Jimmy stumbles upon a clue which makes Katherine confess her part in the crimes, and with this to work on, he sets out to trap the ring-leader.

The climax, which has been building steadily from the opening reel, bursts like a shot upon the startled audience which learns the true identity of the gang leader at the exact moment the school girls do. As the latter are held in a bay by the killer's revolver, so in the audience riveted to the chairs by the tense drama of the moment.

Way back in 1939, when she was only 16, Anne Baxter was rushed to Hollywood and tested for the lead in "Rebecca." She had behind her a smattering of stage experience on Broadway and two years training with Maria Ouspenskaya. She didn't get the role, but, Anne, on the strength of those tests, was rewarded with a long-term 20th Century-Fox contract which, it might be added, did her more good than any one role could have.

Now she has the best role of her career in "The Pied Piper," now at the Quilna theatre, as a French damsel who helps Monty Woodley shepherd a group of children, including Roddy McDowall, thru the hands of the Gestapo to safety.
