LOUIS-(U.R)-Naval work in six shipyards at midwestern river ports will be suspended Nov. 15 because of a shortage of critical materials, according to Capt. M. Gordon Donald, supervisor of shipbuilding for the St. Louis district. The shipyards are located at Memphis. Tenn.; Quincy, Ill.; Omaha, Nebr.; Kansas City, Mo., Bl.: and Kansas City and Leaven-worth, Kan. They have been pro-ducing or are under contract to produce special types of naval auxiliary vessels. Early this month work on the \$3,000,000 yards of the Missouri Shipbuilding Corp. south of here was halted due to the shortage of steel.






