Educator Says ROTC Not on War Basis

LAWRENCE, Kan. (U.P.)—Chancellor Deane W. Mallot of the University of Kansas charged Tuesday that the Reserve Officers Training Corps in American colleges and universities still is on a peacetime basis. He said a large proportion of the able-bodied men students at universities were enrolled in some kind of reserve organization but said that they were loosely organized, and that no definite course of study had been laid down for them with a view to their service in the war effort. "At the present time," Mallot said, "they (the student reserves) are very loosely controlled—only a few attempts to stipulate an educational program and only then in the broadest terms. The other enlisted reserves make no specific educational demands nor do they require a speed-up program." He predicted that closer cooperation between university and military authorities would lead to formulation of definite speed-up in curricula for the training of student reserves.

3,002 Axis Planes Downed in Mideast

LONDON (U.P.)—A total of 3,002 enemy planes have been shot down in the Mideast theater since the war began, a British press association compilation showed Tuesday. The figures include the 13 enemy craft reported shot down in Tuesday's campaign from Cairo and more than 1,000 shot down over Malta. It does not include planes destroyed on the ground.

Official Opposes Medical 'Draft'

Don't Allocate Doctors, Dr. Parran Urges

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Surgeon General Thomas Parran of the United States public health service said Tuesday he was not in favor of compulsory allocation of physicians at this time. Parran testified before a senate education and labor subcommittee which is investigating methods to protect the health of the country by possible enactment of a national service act for the medical profession. "I am not prepared to recommend the allocation of doctors by a national service act," Parran said. "We may need to come to that on the medical front in order to alleviate the serious depletion of doctors in many areas, but I would not endorse any compulsory legislation at this time."
