Comedian And Character Actor Will Appear With Vocalist As Special Music Hall Guests

Ginny Simms, popular radio and screen vocalist, will join Bing Crosby, the Charioteers, the Music Mads and Hal, Victor Borge, Ken Carpenter and John Scott Trotter for a session of the Music Hall Thursday at 9 p. m. over WEAF.

In addition Bing will welcome comedian Edward Brophy and Edgar Buchanan, well-known character actor of the films.

Bing's solos will be "Ho Hum," from his forthcoming film, "The Road To Morocco"; "Moonlight Becomes You," "June In January," "Dear Old Pal Of Mine" and "Prize The Lord And Pass The Ammunition" with the Charioteers. The Charioteers will sing "Hallelujah" and "Rose Of Tralee." Ginny's solos will be the current swing sensation "Mr. Five

By Five" and "White Christmas," from Irving Berlin's "Holiday Inn." Together she and Bing will sing "You Are My Song Of Love," from "Blossom Time."

NAVAL LOSSES SINCE DEC. 7 TOTAL 16,527

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (INS)—The total number of sailors, marines and coast guardsmen reported dead, wounded and missing from Dec. 7 to Oct. 31 was brought to 16,527 today when the Navy announced that naval casualties totaled 728 from Oct. 16 to Oct. 31.

The latest Navy casualty list, No. 16, covering personnel of the Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard, showed that 172 of them were killed, 315 wounded and 211 reported missing during the last half of October.

A recapitulation of casualties in the naval forces since the Japs struck at Pearl Harbor Dec. 7, follows:

The story presents Wayne as a squadron leader who, distressed by the overwhelming odds pitted against his command, drafts into the Group a young flier of indisputable personal courage but of doubtful motives. Woody Jason—played by John Carroll—is interested chiefly in the five hundred dollars bonus he will receive for every plane he bags, rather than in the cause for which he fights. He soon incurs the enmity of all the other fliers, particularly when it appears that he failed to save a fellow flier in his zeal to bring down more planes and earn more bonuses.

Wayne never loses faith in his friend, however, and this faith is ultimately rewarded by an act of spectacular bravery on Carroll's part which once and for all establishes him in the good graces and high esteem of the other Flying Tigers.

With excellent roles in "How Green Was My Valley" and "My Life With Caroline" to her credit, Anna Lee scores again in the feminine lead of "Flying Tigers."
