

# Sophisticated New Yorker Dresses As Girl At Ohio

## Stop-Off In Youths' Military Academy Enlivens Proceedings In "The Major And The Minor"

Ray Milland and Ginger Rogers have the leading roles of the film, "The Major and the Minor," now at the Ohio theatre. The story concerns a sophisticated New Yorker who dresses as a young girl and sets out for Iowa, with a stop in a youth's military academy. Others in the cast are Robert Benchley, Rita Johnson, Diana Lynn and Ginger's mother, Lela Rogers.

John Wayne, Anna Lee and John Carroll are the impressive line-up offered in "Flying Tigers," the Friday preview film at the Quilna theatre. 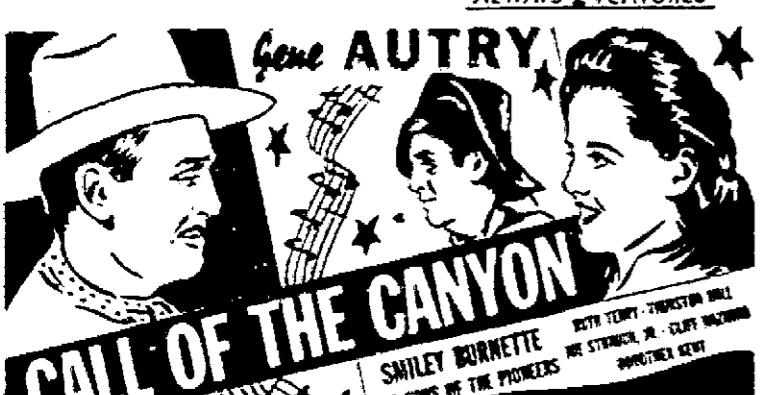
