# **WPB Smashes** Firm That Wasted Rubber *Maiestic*

NEW YORK -- (U.P.) -- A War Production board order, the most drastic of its kind ever issued, today forbade a rubber mat manufacturer to buy, sell, or handle any kind of rubber until six months after the war.

A WPB official said the order "virtually puts the firm out of business."

The firm was the Empire State Mat Co., Inc., which was accused of having illegally bought 7,236 used automobile tires and cut them up for bath room mats for sale to




