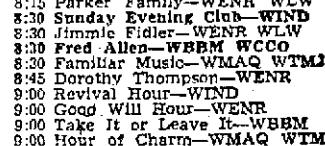

Federation Plan Revealed for Europe

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Dr. Henry K. Strassburger, minister of finance in the Polish government at London, today disclosed a post-war formation of a federation of 110,000,000 peoples in central Europe comprising what formerly was Poland, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, and Greece. The federation would have one parliament and one ministry, and the aim of eventually becoming a customs union, he said. Representatives of the exile governments of those four nations already have entered into a joint declaration which may be considered the foundation of such a bloc, he added. The bloc would want outlets to the world seas northward through the ports of Danzig and Gdynia and southward through what is now Italian Trieste, Greek Salonika, and possibly Rumanian Constantza, according to Strassburger. He said he thought Germans should be moved from East Prussia to make the plan succeed. He believed the bloc would create a great potential market for United States exports and would seek investments from this country to help it industrialize.

Even bidding the other minor is better bridge than raising your partner's minor, as it shows him a second suit stopped and may prove the key to a perfectly safe No Trump game, requiring only nine tricks instead of eleven.

Hathaway, Milwaukee, was retained as president. Walter Jensen, Racine, and John Meyert, Superior, were elected vice-presidents; Roy E. Shaw, Madison, secretary-treasurer.

Predicts Jap Quake

UNIVERSITY OF SANTA CLARA, Calif. — (U.P.) — The worst, in more ways than one, is yet to come for the Japanese in the present war, according to Dr. Albert Newlin, famed director of the Observatory of the University of Santa Clara. He predicts for next year in Japan one of the world's worst earthquakes, comparable to that of 1923 and that of 1933. They follow a 10-year cycle, he stated.
