Announcements affecting fuel oil rationing and gasoline allocations for truck and taxi operators and other holders of certificates of war necessity were made Saturday by Vern G. Zeller, chairman of the Dane county ration board.

Zeller said application blanks to be filled out by certificate holders were available at the ration office, 117 Monona ave., and urged persons in the group to call for them "as soon as possible." Registration will take place Friday from 4 to 5 p. m. and Saturday from 1 to 5 p. m. at the ration office, and the forms should be made out in advance.

The office advised fuel oil dealers to continue to sell oil to individuals since consumers' coupons have not arrived.

"The dealer should take a receipt and keep it on file," Zeller said.
