2 BROTHERS DIE OF INJURIES IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Double funeral services were being arranged Monday for Savage and Edward Patrick, brothers, who died in Memorial hospital of injuries suffered early Saturday in an automobile accident in Route 69, four miles south of Lima.

Savage, 21, suffered internal injuries and shock and at first was not believed seriously hurt. Edward, 23, suffered head and chest injuries.

The brothers had moved to this vicinity a year ago with their parents, who reside on a farm two miles south of McGuffey.

Edward had been employed by the Pennsylvania railroad but had not been working for the last three months because of an injury. Savage was employed at the Superior Coach Corp. He had received orders Friday in report for his army induction physical examination.

Their surviving relatives are their parents, Mrs. and Mrs. Kinzel Patrick; three sisters, Cassie, Roxie and Grace, all at home, and two brothers, Ashford of Finken and Irwin of McDonald-up, Hardin-up.
