## **Allies Offer Aid** to French Ships

### **Submarine Arrives** at Barcelona

LONDON -(U.P.)- Arrival at Barcelona of a French submarine from Toulon bolstered hope Saturday that more submarines and perhaps surface units had escaped the scuttling of the French fleet and might join Allied naval forces in North Africa.

The submarine, which was given 24 hours to leave Barcelona or be interned, was the first French warship known definitely to have escaped Toulon.
