Winston Churchill's Address to Be Presented at 3 by WIBA

Prime Minister Winston Churchill will make a worldwide radio broadcast at 3 p. m. today, with WIBA carrying his address in this area.

Churchill will make his talk on the eve of his 68th birthday anniversary. While the subject has not been announced, it was believed he would discuss the general war outlook. Churchill made his last radio address May 10, the second anniversary of the German invasion of Holland and Belgium and of his ascendancy to the prime minister's post.

WIBA to Offer Music Program for Children

Allied Troops Land on French Island in Indian Ocean

LONDON—(AP)—Vichy reports said Saturday night that South African troops have landed on Reunion island, a French possession in the Indian ocean, in a move obviously designed to safeguard the Allied supply line to India.

The landing was made at 4 a. m. (9 p. m. Friday EWT), and, although resistance to the occupation was reported being organized, the invasion forces succeeded in taking Saint-Denis, the island's capital, according to Vichy.

Reunion, one of the Mascarene group, lies approximately 300 miles off the east coast of Madagascar. It is 790 square miles in area and has a population of 173,315.

General of Jesuits Seriously Ill in Rome 5

MADRID—(AP)—Reports from Rome said Saturday that the Rev. Wladimir Ledochowski, general of the Society of Jesus, is gravely ill and has been transferred from a clinic to his residence where the last sacrament of the church was administered. He has been general of the society since Feb. 2, 1915. Pope Pius expressed utmost concern over his condition.

Allies Offer Aid to French Ships

Submarine Arrives at Barcelona
