43,667 Britons Killed

by German Air Raids LONDON - (U.P.) - The home ministry, in its first official report on the historic "Battle of Britain," announced Monday that 43,667 civilians, including 3,460 children, had been killed in air raids by the end of 1941.

The ministry reported that more than 1,000 persons were killed in each of the three heaviest German air attacks last year-Apr. 16, Apr.
