
Good Jellows!

The navy said, however, that their design was changed to in-corporate "results learned in naval battles of World War II."

In announcing the launching, which is "a weighty emphasis to the growth of the U. S. navy since the Pearl Harbor attack," the navy said that it will take place at a time when "a series of night battles in the Solomons and fogbound action in the Aleutians have emphasized the usefulness of the battleship, which can surmount handicaps of weather that hamper or halt plane activity."

The New Jersey, second battle-

ship to bear the name of that state, will be sponsored by Mrs. Charles Edison, wife of the former secretary of the navy and present governor of New Jersey.
