Shipyards Win Over Sinkings

650 Boats Delivered During Year So Far

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—American shipyards Monday ended their first year of wartime construction a winner in the race of ship production versus submarine sinkings.

The Maritime Commission estimated that 650 ocean-going merchant vessels, aggregating 8,200,000 deadweight tons, were delivered into service in 1942.

Axis submarines were outdistanced by American shipbuilders for the year although in the first year of war they were sinking merchantmen at an alarmingly faster rate than the ships could be produced.

The United Press compilation of merchant ship sinkings in the western Atlantic since the first of the year, when the submarines initiated their campaign in those waters, shows that at least 591 Allied and neutral ships have been sunk.

Clintonville was taken from the shortage list with the seasonal return of farmers to the Four Wheel Drive truck factory there.

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Here is a box score of the first year of war's toll of Japanese and American ships in the Pacific and the Far East, as announced by official United States communiques.

The list includes only ships announced as sunk, eliminating apparent duplications. Those probably sunk or damaged are omitted in this comparison because damage to American warships usually is not announced.
