Truth is not only stranger than fiction but often better motion picture. This is true of "No Greater Sin" at the Lyric, the story of a doctor who fights a city to conquer the vice conditions contributing to the spread of venereal disease infection which face hundreds of communities today.

That this problem is currently recognized by local and national authorities is evidenced by two vitally important national projects—the U. S. O. and the W. P. A. The U. S. O., the preventive measure, functions to provide service men with healthful entertainment and diversion.

The incidence of venereal disease infection among draftees is 75% less frequent today than in the last World War. This can be largely attributed to the education of the public promulgated by the U. S. Public Health Service, and the American Social Hygiene Assn., a national voluntary organization.

There is no greater sin than secrecy and willful blindness to a condition of such national importance. More than the disease

Lima slowly but surely is getting to be a great deal like an "old western cow town." But its men can be considered somewhat softer than the western "toughies."

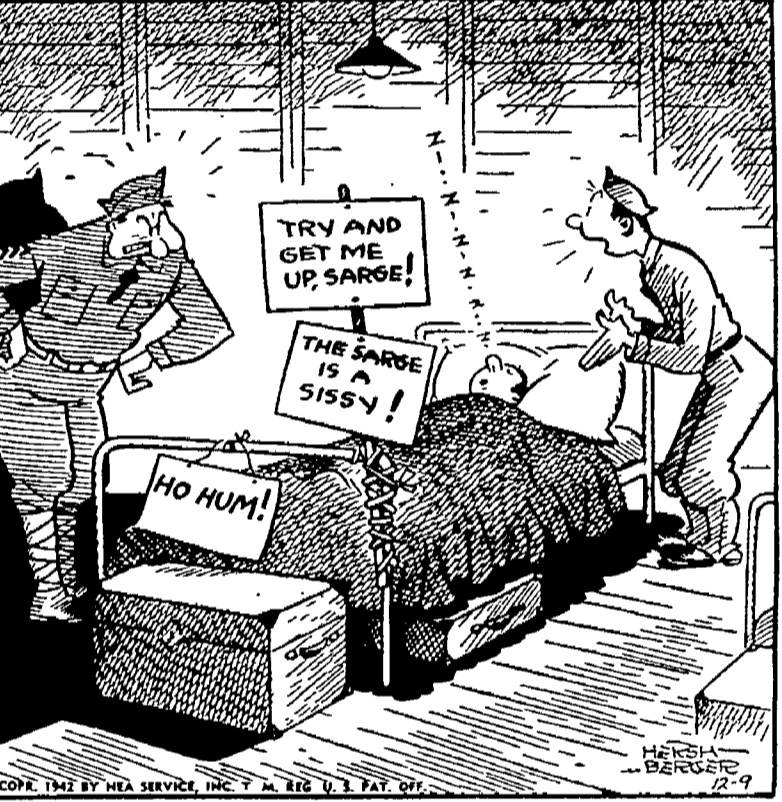
