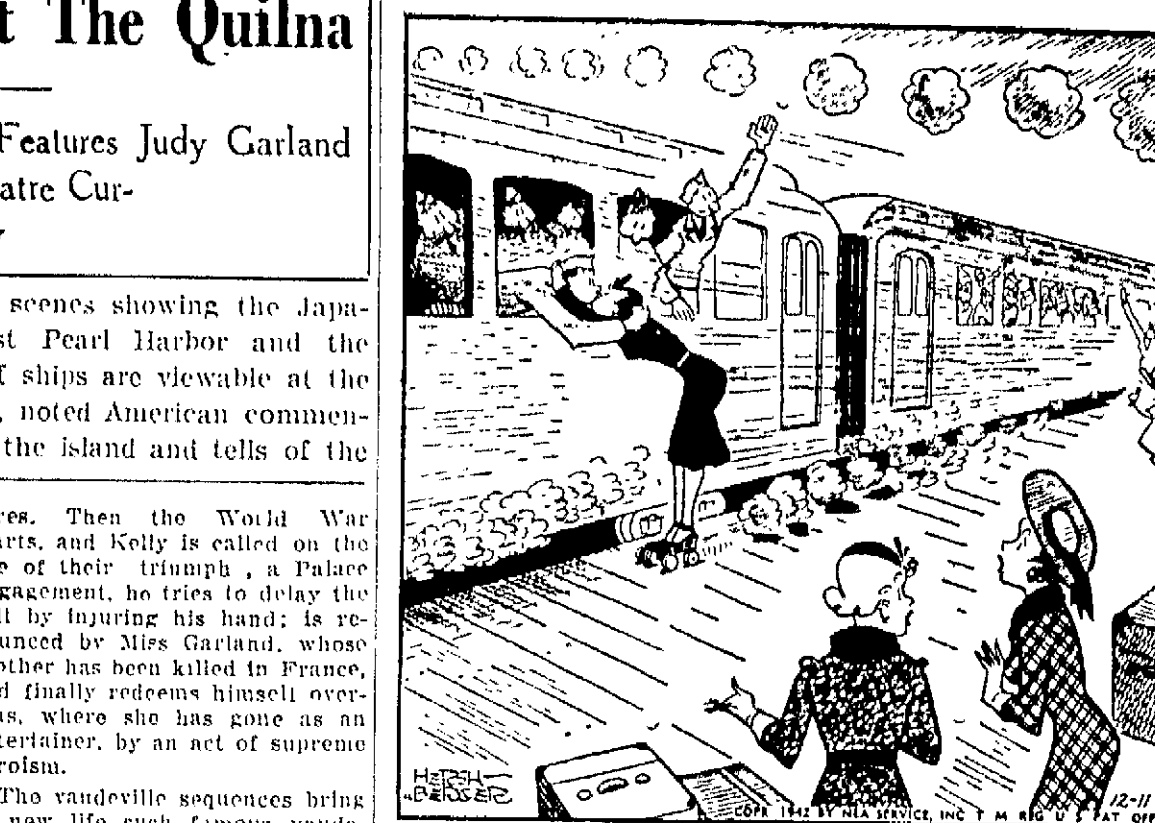

Other principals are George Murphy, Ben Blue, Lucille Norman, Richard Quine, Keenan Wynn and Florence McNally.

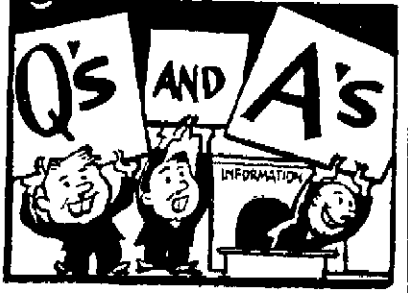

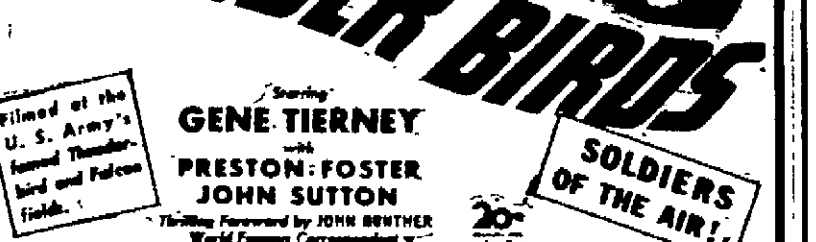
