power. "It is the result of a half century of mistaken policy or lack of policy with respect to farm land, farm credit, marketing, and distribution," Patton said.

"Actually, today's present available farm manpower could produce at least 35 per cent more than the 1942 crops. At the same time it is true that farm production has been hurt by the drafting of thousands of farm operators vitally needed in food production."
