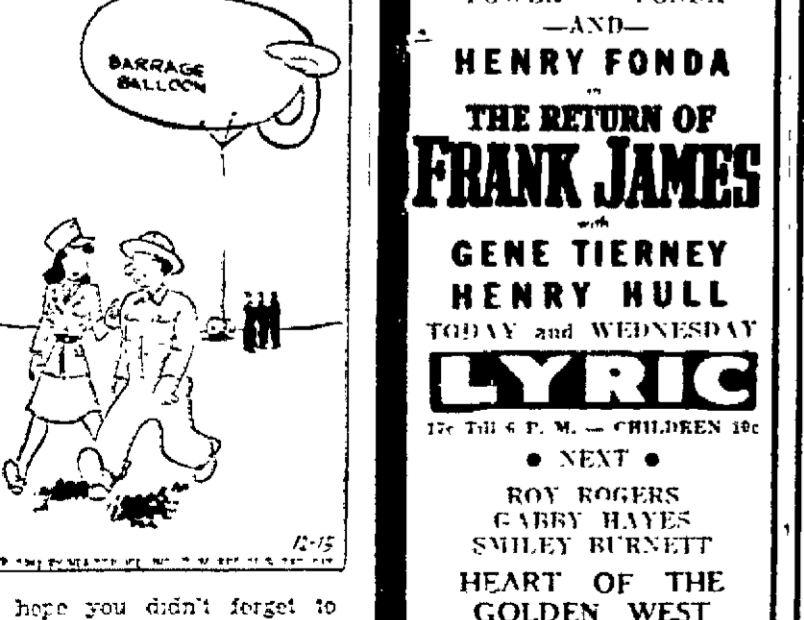

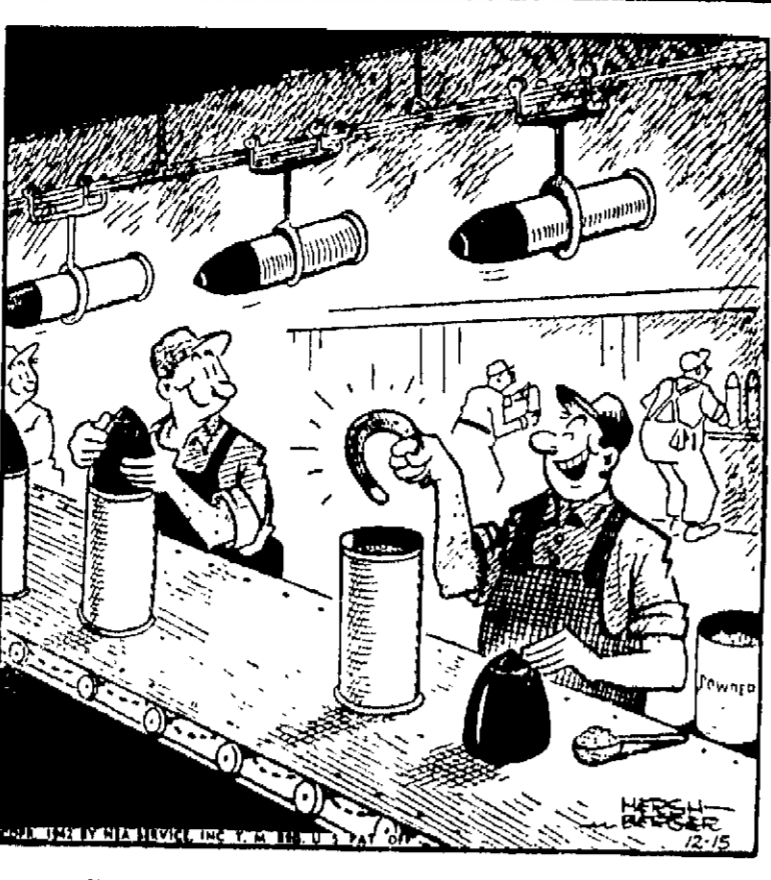

Mystery Romance Opens At Sigma Theatre Wednesday

"Nightmare," a mystery-romance attraction, is scheduled to open Wednesday at the Sigma with Brian Donlevy and Diana Barrymore in the leading roles. Second hit will be "Where Trails End," a thrill-a-minute action feature, with Tom Keene portraying a U. S. marshal.

Resuming its run at the Ohio theatre Tuesday is "For Me and My Gal," a film packed with many favorite musical tunes. This nostalgic story of the heyday of vaudeville features youthful Judy Garland, Gene Kelly and George Murphy.

Currently attracting patrons to the Quilna is "Thunder Birds," a first rate action picture filmed in technicolor. Gene Tierney and Preston Foster have the love interest in this hit which tells of America's fighter. "That Other Woman" completes the Quilna bill.

Tuesday and Wednesday will be the final days for the showing of "Seven Sweethearts" at the State. A reporter finds great enjoyment in a new love in a small Michigan town which is celebrating a tulip festival. Second hit is "A Yank at Eton," with the young cut-up, Mickey Rooney.

Two great action pictures, "Jesse James" and "The Return of Frank James" will show at the Lyric Tuesday and Wednesday. In the first feature—a technicolor hit—Tyronne Power portrays the bad man and other featured are Henry Fonda and Nancy Kelly. In the other hit, Fonda, Gene Tierney and Jackie Cooper are featured.

Interesting advance data concerning the picture reveals that the plot is based on a story by Philip MacDonald. It deals with the murder of one Captain Stafford, portrayed by Henry Daniell, and the strange series of events which subsequently implicate his estranged wife, played by Miss Barrymore who flees the scene of the crime with a total stranger. Donlevy has the role of this very mysterious but irrepresible individual. The story of a group of ranchers fighting to keep enemy agents

from getting control of a secret tungsten "find" is told in "Where Trails End," western starring Tom Keene at the Sigma theatre. Others in the cast are Joan Curtis, Frank Yaconelli and Donald Stewart.
