"Half-Way To Shanghai" And "Sherlock Holmes In The Voice Of Terror" Are Co-Starred Thursday

Coming to the State theatre on Thursday will be a drama about Oriental spies, "Half-Way to Shanghai," starring Irene Hervey and Kent Taylor.
