Make Believe Yule Planned by Service Men in Far East

WITH THE U. S. AIR FORCE IN CHINA —(UP)— It will be a "make-believe" Christmas for America's fighting men in remote Far Eastern outposts this year. The Axis has sunk the transport bringing special Christmas post exchange supplies and presents to India and China. Traditional mistletoe and Christmas trees are unobtainable. And Americans in China will have to mark Christmas hours ahead of the rest of the world because of time differences. Turkey Flown In The army is striving to bring a touch of Christmas to men here, however, and it is hoped supplies of turkey—1,800 pounds of turkey reported sent to Calcutta—will arrive in time, as well as chocolate, cigars, tobacco, and quantities of presents that will be ferried by air from India. High spot in the yule festivities will be the enlisted men's dance at the newly-inaugurated "Victory club," at Chungking—the first dance organized by the army in West China. Alice A. "Billie" Todd, the North Attleboro, Mass., "morale builder" Red Cross nurse—first American servicewoman permitted by Lieut. Gen. Joseph H. Stilwell, American commander in China, Burma, and India, to come to China—is overcoming hundreds of obstacles to arrange the "Victory club" party. Lacking fir trees, Miss Todd is hoping to find a presentable bush for the soldiers' "tree." Music for the party will be furnished by a scant collection of phonograph records contributed by the men. China's "new life" movement is giving Miss Todd her biggest headache—finding dancing partners for the men. The movement

WPB Gets Full Power for Scheduling

WASHINGTON —(UP)— The extent of the victory won by War Production Board Chairman Donald M. Nelson over the military services in their recent clash over the output of war weapons was disclosed Saturday night in a series of administrative orders outlining the authority of WPB Vice Chairman Charles E. Wilson. "The dispute arose over scheduling powers. Under orders from Pres. Roosevelt, the disputants reached an agreement. Its terms never were made public. Nelson's administrative orders place in Wilson full responsibility for all production scheduling. "Subject to the direction of the chairman of the war production board (Nelson) and with the advice and assistance of the production executive committee, (Wilson) shall be responsible for and shall direct the scheduling of the various production programs of the army, navy, maritime commission, and other agencies participating in the national war production program, in order to ensure that program schedules do
