Two Schools Promise Classes

MILWAUKEE—(UP)—Heads of two higher educational institutions here today said that war exigencies would have some effect on their schools but would in no way prevent them from remaining open during the second semester.

But War to Affect Marquette, Teachers

Neither the Rev. Raphael C. McCarthy, S. J., president of Marquette university, nor Dr. Frank Baker, head of Milwaukee State Teachers' college knew the status of their schools in relation to the government's plan to return 250,000 inducted men for studies leading to officer ratings. Fr. McCarthy spiked rumors that Marquette would not open the second semester in a letter to all undergraduates. Recent War Manpower Commission announcements: that members of campus reserve units of the armed forces would be called to active duty were said to have resulted in the story of the school's closing.

University authorities have been informed that six classes of reserves will be allowed to remain in class "at least" until after June of 1943. These are V-1, V-5 and V-7 naval reserve and all marine reserves; naval ROTC members; premedical and pre dental students enlisted in the army reserve; premedical, pre dental and engineering students who have completed one year (by arrangement with their draft boards); army aviation cadets, and all medical and dental students.

Dr. Baker said the Teachers college would lose some of its enrollment because of the 18-19 year old draft call but that the enrollment was predominately women and there was no question of closing. He cited the great need for teachers. In relation to the possibility of inductees being sent to the college, Dr. Baker pointed out that there were no dormitories on the campus nor nearby hotels the government could take over. The only possibility, he said was that the gymnasium and field house might be converted into barracks for such students.

Slain Woman Found in Mine

ELDORADO, Ill. (UP)—The long black hair of a slain woman, whose nude body was recovered from a flooded coal mine shaft, gave authorities their only clew today to her identity.

The hair, waist long, was the only distinctive feature of the body which authorities estimated had been weighted and thrown into the shaft as long as six months or a year ago. The woman's ankles were tied together with a six foot length of half inch hemp rope. A piece of concrete, weighing about 100 pounds, was attached to the other end.

Night Club Owner Slain

CHICAGO (UP)—Detectives attempted today to link the gang-style slaying of Robert McLaughlin, tavern owner and former president of the Checker Cab Co., to an underworld dispute with remnants of the Al Capone gang.

After investigating for 24 hours, police had uncovered no definite clues to the identity of the man who took McLaughlin for a "ride"

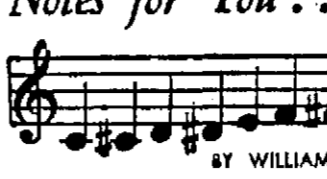

That liquor shipment was not destroyed in a fire at McLaughlin's tavern Dec. 14, and it later was trucked away. Although the fire had been believed accidental at the time, authorities have begun an investigation to determine whether it might have been incendiary in origin.
