U. S. Air Force Held Independent of Burma Road

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Brig. Gen. Claire L. Chennault's China air task force—which now is shooting down Japanese planes at a ratio of 12 to one—can be built up and supplies by air transported without the facilities of the Japanese-held Burma road, Col. Merian C. Cooper said Saturday.

Cooper, former chief of staff to Chennault, has just returned from China. He told a press conference it would be a "cinch" to maintain a superior air force there without recapturing the vital land link of the Burma road.

The flier, who lives at Beverly Hills, Calif., praised Chennault. "Most people think of him only as an air fighter commander," he said.

Army Board Studies Riot

MPs, Civilians to Be Questioned

GREAT FALLS, Mont. (U.P.)—A three-man military board of inquiry planned today to question the six persons injured in a Christmas night riot which allegedly started when two military policemen attacked a Great Falls high school youth.

The injured, four civilians and the MP's, still were under treatment, but only one, Irene Detsch, 18, Great Falls, was in serious condition. She was shot in the arm and may have to undergo amputation.

Maj. John L. Eaton, commanding at the Great Falls air base, appealed to the public to reserve judgment on the military policemen until all the facts of the case are known.

Civilian authorities charged the two MP's "unprovokedly assaulted" Charles Kirwan, 18, in the Oasis night club at Black Eagle, Mont. They had entered the club to question Roy Gardner, 18, about an army-style leather jacket he was wearing.

In the ensuing struggle the MP's, Corp. Joe Campbell, 26, formerly of Macon, Ga., and Pvt. John MacMillan, 23, Newton, N. J., fired 10 shots which struck four civilians, two men and two women.

Before they were subdued, Campbell and MacMillan and numerous civilians had been mauled. The MP's were removed to the air base hospital under guard and treated for bruises and lacerations.

Maj. Charles E. Clapp, Maj. Carlyle D. Hoffman, and Lieut. Howard Goeller, who were appointed to conduct the inquiry, heard 40 witnesses Sunday.

Smallpox Hits Three Counties in Pennsylvania

LEWISTOWN, Pa. (U.P.)—Roads leading to the Big Valley area of Mifflin and Huntingdon counties and a section of Kishacoquillas and were blocked off by state police Saturday as health authorities sought to control an outbreak of smallpox which had infected at least 28 persons.

The blockade had the effect of quarantining approximately 6,000 persons and hampered produce marketing and war production in the area.

State health department epidemiologists surveyed the situation in the valleys and checked the possibility that the disease may have been carried outside the quarantined area before the restrictions were imposed.

The outbreak was traced to an Ohio woman who attended a large Amish wedding Nov. 23 at Bellefonte.

Inventor of Volley Ball Dies at 72

LOCKPORT, N. Y. (U.P.)—Funeral services were arranged today for William G. Morgan, 72, inventor of volley ball. He died Sunday.

Morgan devised the game shortly after his graduation in 1894 from the School of Christian Workers of Springfield during his acquaintanceship with Dr. James A. Naismith, the father of basketball. He wanted a game for businessmen unable to stand the exertion of a more strenuous sport.
