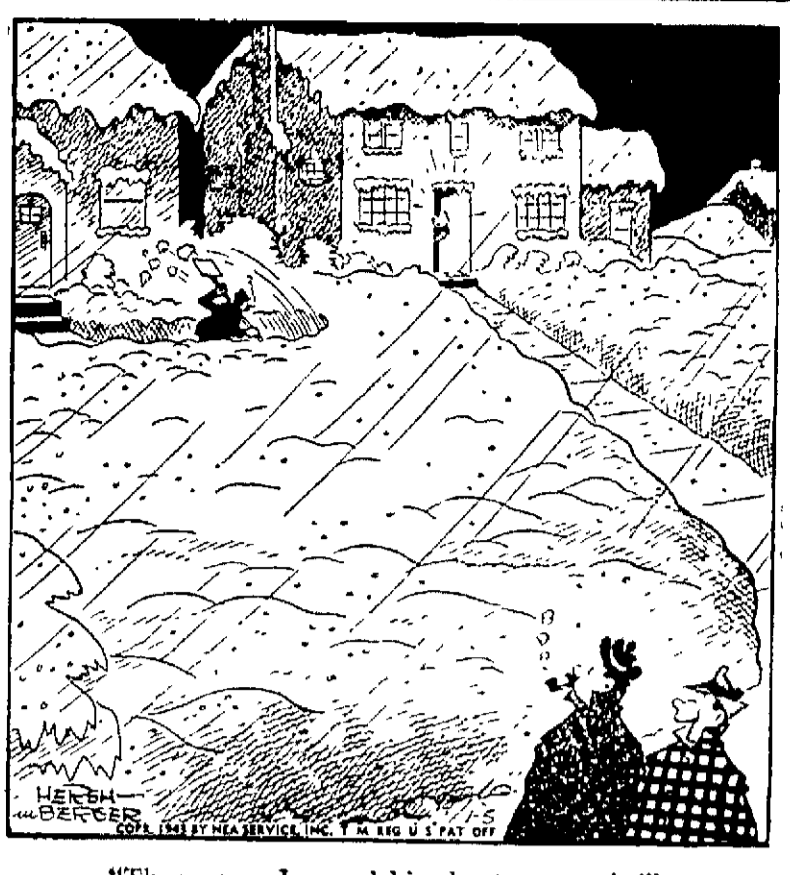

QUICK VICTORY FOR ALLIES IS SULTAN'S HOPE

Zanzibar Rules Guides 250,000 Subjects Under British Direction

ZANZIBAR, Jan. 5 — (AP) — The recent Allied successes in North Africa are highly pleasing to Sayyid Sir Khalifa Bin Harun, sultan of Zanzibar and longest-reigning of all non-European rulers.

"I have followed these events closely on the wireless," he told this correspondent in fluent English, "and I feel sure that, with the will of God, all of North Africa will fall into Allied hands."

The sultan, who is 63, has ruled for 31 years and is keenly interested in the diminution of Italian and German influence in North Africa, and, of course, in the halting of the Japanese.

Dressed in a simple gown of blue with fine gold cord and wearing a varicolored turban, he explained that it had not been easy for the Arab peoples to follow the progress of the Far-East war. "My own people here," he said, "know the Chinese mainly through the curio trade which we used to carry on with Hong Kong. And the Japanese they know only thru the infrequent visits of fishermen from Japan."

Born in Muscat, (diving port of Oman in southeast Arabia and birthplace of many famous Arab rulers, the sultan has influential connections thruout the Arab world, and his friendship with Great Britain has done much to cement Anglo-Arabian relations.

"The Italian conquest of Abyssinia," he continued, "and the subsequent expansion of the Italians into British Somaliland at the beginning of this present war, obviously worried the Arab world more than the later sweep of the Japanese."

"We are glad the Japanese have been stopped, but best news of all would be a clean sweep of Italian and German influence in North Africa."

The sultan has the charm that romantic tradition expects from Arab chieftains. He also inherits great skill in handling his own sailing-boats, and until quite recently rode fiery horses brought down from Arabia.

The sultan administers his domain under the watchful eyes of British officials, led by a British

resident (now Sir Guy Pilling, whose only son recently gave his life in RAF service). Zanzibar has been a British protectorate since 1890, when the British forestalled the Germans in putting it in their own "sphere of influence."

The uncrowned king of Zanzibar is doubtless the president of the Clove Growers' union, for on this spice hangs the fat not only of this island but also the sister island, Pemba, to the north.
