



WAR JOB URGED AS TEMPORARY WORK IS ENDED

Men and women who held temporary jobs during the pre-holiday shopping season were urged Wednesday by John W. Saunders, manager of the Lima office of the United States Employment Service, to register immediately for war jobs.

"We are hopeful that extra employees and others who have been engaged in Christmas sales activity will place their applications at once for war jobs," Saunders said.

He explained that workers who were hired for the temporary season can do no finer service for themselves or their country than to go to the U. S. Employment Service and register for jobs in local war plants.

Saunders said that many persons who have been engaged in civilian goods and service establishments and who were reluctant to leave their employers in their busiest season are filing applications now and they will be referred to jobs for which they are fitted or for which they can be trained quickly.
