

# Joe E. Brown Bowls And Traps Nazi Spies In Quilna Film

### Another Espionage Plot Completes Program Opening Friday Night; Hedy Lamarr Cavorts At Ohio

In "The Daring Young Man" which opens Friday night at the Quilna preview, Joe E. Brown plays the roles of a champion bowler and a big-mouthed comedian who helps trap a band of Nazis spies. Completing the bill is "Counter-Espionage," an action packed melodrama concerning Nazi spies in war-time London. Warren William and Eric Blore have two leading roles.

Stark drama at a rubber station deep in the African jungles provides gripping entertainment in the Ohio's current hit, "White Cargo." Hedy Lamarr portrays the glamorous but sinister Tondelavo and Walter Pidgeon is a fighting plantation overseer. Frank Morgan and Richard Carlson also have leading roles. The management has announced that all is in readiness for Art Jarrett who brings his famous orchestra to the Ohio stage on Monday for four shows.

Scheduled to open this weekend at the Sigma is "Pittsburgh" a brawny, bawling story of a town that was built on muscle. Marlene Dietrich, Randolph Scott and John Wayne have three of the leading roles. Showing Friday at the Sigma will be "I Married a Witch" and "Dynamite Canyon."

The Majestic is showing "Doctor's Don't Tell" and "Broadway" on Friday and Saturday. Now showing at the Lyric is "Riders of the Northland," a gun-blazing story of Texas rangers fighting Nazis saboteurs in far-off Alaska. Charles Starrett and Russell Hayden are the heroes in this thriller. The second hit, "Top Sergeant," has Andy Devine, Leo Carrillo, Don Terry and Elyse Knox in the leading roles.

At the State is "Eyes in the Night," a picture which deals with the adventures of a blind detective who, aided by his "seeing eye" dog, solves a murder case and rounds up a foreign spy ring. Second picture on the bill is "Wildcat," in which Richard Arlen portrays an oil wildcatter.

OHIO Coming to Ohio theatre on Monday thru arrangements with Music Corporation of America are Art Jarrett, the handsome, golden voiced tenor, and his new orchestra, made up of the members of the late Hal Kemp's great band. Art, who started his hand-leading career at the Blackhawk restaurant in Chicago, recently finished an engagement there that lasted over three months, with his new band. In the interim he has played with great success at the College Inn of the Sherman hotel in Chicago; the Meadowbrook Country club in St. Louis; the Adolphus hotel in Dallas; the Muehlebach hotel in Kansas City; the Claridge hotel in Memphis; and the Book-Cadillac hotel in Detroit, to name a few of the outstanding engagements.

As a soloist Art first distinguished himself with Ted Weems and Isham Jones and then co-starred in the movies with Joan Crawford, Carole Lombard, Ann Sothern and Sonja Henie, where his combination of good looks and a good voice carried him far.

On the air Art has sung for "Talsi-BH" show, Fitch Shampoo, Florshelm shoes, Shell Oil, Union Oil and the Ford Motor Co. as well as for Plymouth and Chrysler. Currently he and his famous orchestra are recording for Victor.

Versatile Art is an all-around athlete, among his other accomplishments, and the holder of two tennis championships, for which he keeps in training every day. Showing Friday is "White Cargo," with Hedy Lamarr.

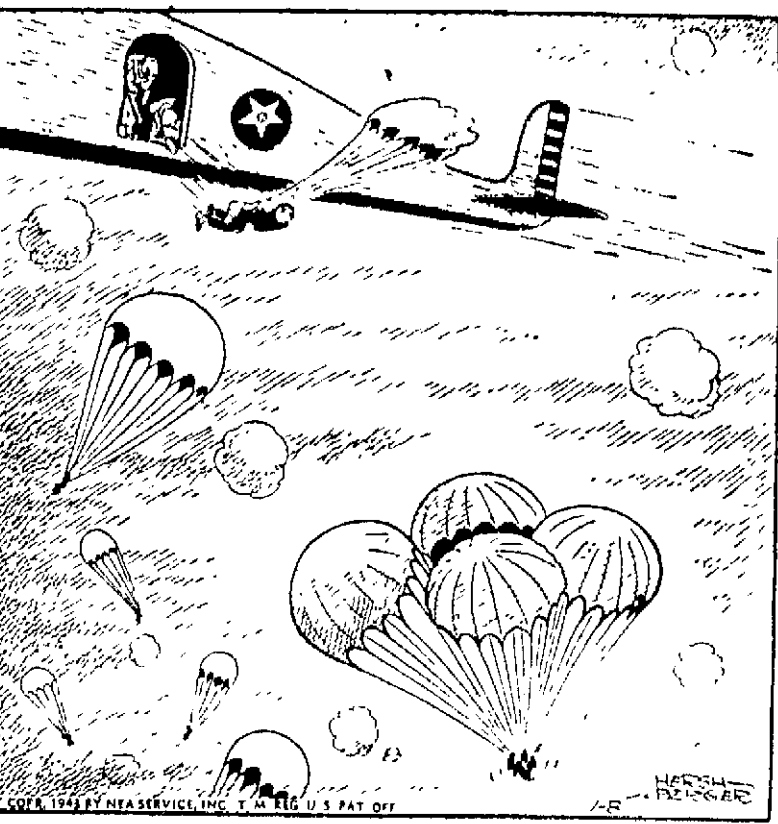
