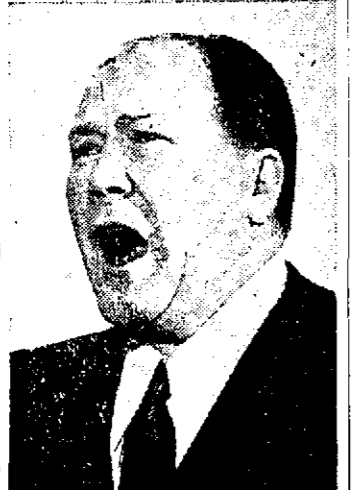


First Session of Legislature to Be Broadcast
