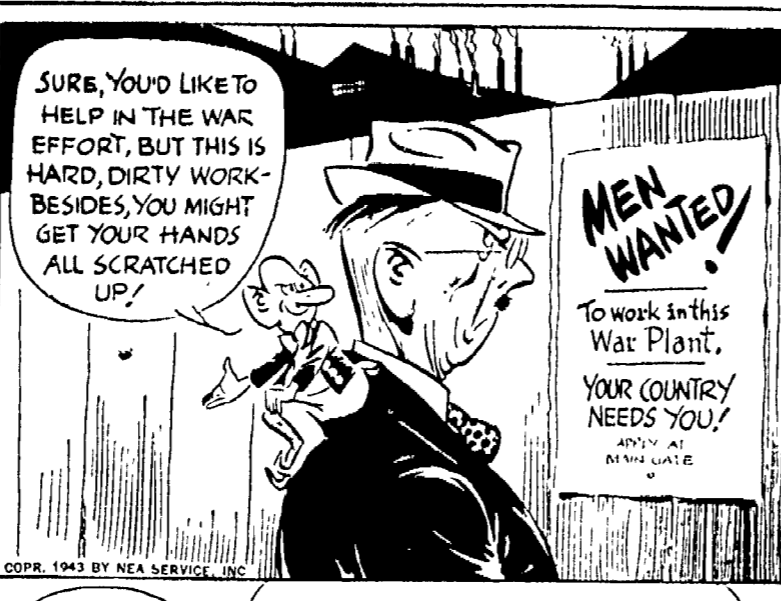

COUNCIL WILL PERMIT SCRAP PILE IN OTTAWA (Ottawa News Bureau) OTTAWA, Jan. 13.—The Putnam-co salvage committee has been granted permission to continue dumping scrap materials on Hickory-st. on the east side of the courthouse here by the Ottawa council.

This was announced today following a special meeting of the legislative group. The action rescinded steps taken last week to halt the dumping of scrap on Hickory-st.

Members of council explained that they voted last week to have the salvage officials remove the scrap as quickly as possible because of complaints that had been received from state fire authorities and local citizens. However, since that time, many persons have contacted the councilmen and made it clear that this scrap pile is not a nuisance because of the patriotic effort it represents.

"We feel that it is our patriotic duty to permit the salvage committee to use this street for scrap storage as long as necessary," a spokesman for the council declared today. He pointed out that the collection of vital salvage materials is being completed as quickly as possible in the various townships.

DELPHOS SOLONS APPROVE BUDGET

Appropriation Ordinance For 1943 Puts Operating Expense At \$119,294

(Lima News Bureau) DELPHOS, Jan. 13 Operating expenses for the city of Delphos for 1943 was placed at \$119,294 by city council which passed the annual appropriation ordinance Tuesday night. The 1942 budget was approximately \$110,000. The sum was broken down by City Auditor Dome Trick, who read the different appropriations as follows:

General fund, \$8,150; water-works fund, \$31,450; street lighting fund, \$10,600; safety fund, \$18,571; health fund, \$1,200; service fund, \$5,080; park fund, \$3,500; bond retirement fund, \$15,400; police fund, \$8,710; firemen's fund, \$8,700; sewage treatment plant fund, \$3,100; service fund, \$3,080; cemetery fund, \$180.

A portion of the appropriation will be asked for Wednesday from the auditors of Van Weert and Allen cos. for council adopted two resolutions, authorizing Mrs. Trick to apply for an advance draw from the two counties.

An ordinance was adopted allowing the engineers at the water-works to draw 65 cents an hour for overtime. Owing to the resignation of the third engineer at the plant, the remaining two work 12 hours each shift. Service Director A. E. Weger, so far has been unable to employ another man with engineer's credentials.

The auditor, who also is clerk of council, read several annual reports. Her own report showed a balance of \$6,711 in the various funds at the close of 1942.

The water-works report revealed receipts of \$23,475 and expenditures, \$18,922. A total of 132,201,800 gallons of water was pumped during the year. Coal consumed was 1,106 tons and its cost was \$5,477.

The police report showed a total of 149 arrests. Nine automobiles reported stolen, were recovered. Forty-three highway collisions were investigated. Firemen answered 43 calls during the year the report of Fire Chief Lewis Leonard showed.

Mayor W. D. Swihart named Hubert Dunn as a member of the city board of health and it was approved by council. He succeeds Dr. C. E. Savage, who resigned, when he moved his practice to Lima.

AGREEMENT ON ELECTION ENDS 2-DAY STRIKE CLEVELAND, O., Jan. 13—(AP)—Unionists at the Carey Machine Co. agreed to end a two-day strike and go back to work today pending a bargaining agent election scheduled next Saturday. The firm holds the Navy "E" award.

The agreement was reached yesterday by representatives of the company and the CIO United Steelworkers of America. The union lost an earlier election by a few votes and the company agreed to recognize the winner of the Saturday balloting as bargaining representative. Walter E. Taag, regional director for the National Labor Relations Board, announced.
