Your Ration Guide, **Dates to Remember**

This is your guide to rationing for Dane county. The ration board here will follow these rules and dates until officially notified that they are to be changed. Sometimes it is several days before the local board is advised of changes, even though The State Journal carries stories from Washington telling of such changes.

FUEL OIL

Jan. 27 - Fuel oil coupon No. 2 expires.

Feb. 1 — Owners of commercial buildings must convert from oil to coal heat by this date or show that arrangements for conversion have been made, or prove conversion impossible. This type of user is not eligible for more fuel oil. Feb. 9 - Fuel oil coupon No. 4 becomes valid.


