Your Ration Guide, Dates to Remember

This is your guide to rationing for Dane county. The ration board here will follow these rules and dates until officially notified that they are to be changed. Sometimes it is several days before the local board is advised of changes, even though The State Journal carries stories from Washington telling of such changes.

FUEL OIL Jan. 27—Fuel oil coupon No. 2 expires. Feb. 1—Owners of commercial buildings must convert from oil to coal heat by this date or show that arrangements for conversion have been made, or prove conversion impossible. This type of user is not eligible for more fuel oil. Feb. 9—Fuel oil coupon No. 4 becomes valid. Feb. 22—Fuel oil coupon No. 3, which became valid Jan. 7 at a value of 11 gallons, expires.

GASOLINE AND TIRES Jan. 21—No. 3 stamp in A gasoline book expires. (Good for four gallons. The eight No. 3 stamps in A book good for a total of 32 gallons through this date.) Jan. 22—No. 4 stamp in A gasoline book becomes valid. (Good for four gallons.) Jan. 31—End of period for obtaining temporary gasoline rations for commercial vehicles. All certificates of war necessity must be corrected by this date to call for proper amount of gasoline. Apply to county farm transportation committee or nearest ODT representative. FEB. 28—Motorists with B or C books or bulk coupons for fleets of trucks must have their first fire inspection at authorized station by this date. B book holders must have tires inspected every four months thereafter, and C and bulk coupon holders every three months. Mar. 21—No. 4 stamp in A gasoline book expires. Mar. 31—Holders of A gas rations must have tires inspected at authorized stations by this date, and every six months thereafter.

SUGAR Jan. 31—No. 10 coupon in war ration book No. 1, good for three pounds, expires at midnight. Feb. 1—No. 11 coupon becomes valid, good for three pounds until Mar. 15. Jan. 31, 1944—All institutional users must keep a record of the use of the 25 commodities listed on the report form received at the time of registration for coffee, until this date.

COFFEE Jan. 25—Final date for retailers to receive deliveries of coffee on purchase warrants. Feb. 5—Registration for February coffee for institutional use ends. February coffee will be issued on a basis of 40 per cent of the base amount. Feb. 7—No. 28 coupon in ration book No. 1, good for one pound of coffee, expires at midnight. Jan. 27—Ration banking system of handling stamps and coupons goes into effect for retailers and wholesalers. Does not affect consumers.

Woman's Right to Talk Snarls Flynn's Trial HOLLYWOOD (U.P.)—The trial of Errol Flynn, charged by two teen-age girls with statutory rape, turned into an argument today about whether a woman loses her right to talk when she becomes a juror.

Rejected Women Complain These accusations, contradictory as they were, came from three other women who failed to make the jury, the Mesdames Harriet Ponder, Emily Blue, and Cussie A. Rowe. Judge Leslie E. Still called all the ladies in for an inquiry. The jury consists of nine women and three elderly men, plus two alternates. Whether the allegedly talkative ladies could be removed and the alternates, who have heard all the testimony to date, could replace them was a possibility the judge was considering.

Speculators Angry More bitter still, apparently, were the spectators, mostly feminine, who have filled every available seat in the small courtroom, and mobbed Flynn at each recess. They demanded autographs, shouted their good wishes and shoved, just for the privilege of touching him. They were manifestly disappointed at the interruption of testimony, mostly of the kind no newspaper would print, concerning high life in Hollywood. Miss Hansen, a movie struck schoolgirl from Nebraska who came to Hollywood and wound up as a waitress at a drug store lunch counter, charged Flynn with attacking her. She had almost finished her story when the prosecution called for a mistrial. Still to be heard is Peggy Satterlee, 16, who accuses Flynn of attacking her twice.

Officials Probe Tanker Damage PORTLAND, Ore. (U.P.)—Federal authorities today sought the cause of the deck-to-keel splitting of the 16,500 ton tanker, Schenectady, first ship built in the Kaiser Swan Island shipyards, and turned out in a record-breaking 115 days. The ship was delivered to the Maritime Commission Saturday afternoon, and a few hours after completing a successful test run, suddenly buckled and cracked in two while tied up at the outfitting dock. A crew of 30 men was aboard at the time, but none was injured seriously. Investigators said no report of their inquiry would be made until all the evidence was presented.
