Dummy Berlins Fail to Confuse U. S. Bomber Pilot

ROYAL AIR FORCE BOMBER STATION somewhere in England—(U.P.)—Two dummy cities, not one as previously believed, rigged up outside Berlin to mislead Allied fliers had no effect upon the shooting eye of Flight Sgt. H. Goodwin, 27, Wyncofte, Pa., who piloted a British Lancaster heavy bomber on Saturday night's smash at the German capital.

Goodwin said he dropped his 2-ton "block-buster" right in the center of the real Berlin. It has been long known that the Germans have made efforts to confuse attackers by creating a fake Berlin beyond the outskirts of the real city but Goodwin and his mates saw two mock cities, both easily distinguishable from the real thing which did not give the raiders any trouble.

Goodwin said, "I just ordered my bombardier to hit the center of Berlin—which we did. The big bomb shook the ship as we let it loose." Goodwin has been in the Royal Canadian Air Force two years and has made 10 raids.

Letters From the Marines

Life at his new post on an island with the marines is described by Pvt. Gerald Houlter, son of Mrs. Gertrude Houlter, 616 Crandall ave.
Writing his mother on Nov. 10 Pvt. Houlter said, "I hope you have not been worrying about me as I am in great shape. I have cut off a pair of pants and run around in shorts—in November! Also I am getting nice sun tan and plenty to eat. I have gained almost 10 pounds since I've been here. Still go swimming in the ocean and have seen octopuses, sharks, eels, and all kinds of fish. Still have school on certain subjects. Once in a while I study Spanish. There are quite a few books around to read (Donated by the Victory Book Campaign)."

In a letter of Nov. 22, he wrote, "I can tell you I am on an island. There is nothing grows here because of coral. Some plants—one is 2 1/2 feet high—and plants grow here because we imported some dirt to help them grow. And once in a while you see a little bit of grass growing where some dirt has fallen by accident."

For Thanksgiving he wrote later the marines had turkey, dressing, peas, corn, gravy, potatoes, olives, onions, peaches, bread, butter, jam and cocoa.
"I saw some natives do a dance," he said. "They had big knives about two feet long with a hook in the end. One girl, there were three of them, took one of the knives and cut a pineapple with one stroke. The three girls then stood about eight feet apart and threw those three knives to one another. Then one of the girls hooked two knives together and swung them over her head."

Pvt. Houlter's letter of Dec. 5 to his mother said he had received her presents, book, candy and money belt and several letters from friends. "Do I like to hear from home," he wrote, "and what's going on there. That's about all a person lives for out here. There is nothing to do, no place to go. I can go to the movies free every night now. Once in a while I hear a new broadcast or someone gets a paper and we read the news."

Like Marine Training
From marine "boot camp" at San Diego on Dec. 6, Pvt. Warren Colwill wrote his mother, Mrs. Norman L. Hansen, 414 S. Brearly st., that "no wonder the marines are so tough. I never knew of anyone who took so much pains with you. Why, do you know that they have some of the most expert riflemen and revolver men in the world right here on the range teaching us the tricks? They drill us eight hours a day, six days a week for three weeks, which makes 94 hours in all, which they take to teach us just how to shoot and get in the positions."

"That's just for the rifle alone. You're supposed to fire a rifle at 300 yards when you're through, and fire 10 shots at 500 yards and the spot made by 10 bullets. shouldn't be bigger than a dime. Ninety-eight per cent of them do it by the time they leave here. No wonder the marines are winning all over. You don't need to worry about us not being well trained. They also spent four weeks on us just marching. It's worth it."

After finishing "boot camp," Pvt. Colwill was assigned to an aviation training post at Memphis, Tenn. At present he is home on special leave. He will report for his new duties on Jan. 28.
